From The Pastors Desk...

As a Basilian, I take the three vows of Poverty, Chastity, and Obedience. When I first took those vows, about 35 years ago, I thought the difficult one would be Chastity. Little did I know that, although all three are at the same time difficult and liberating, and impossible to live at 100%, the one that I find hardest is Poverty. While I own very little, I also have immense security. The Basilian Fathers make sure that I have everything I need; I have complete job security. Although my salary goes to the local house instead of to me, I can spend money as I see fit. When I see a gospel passage like the one this Sunday, then, I squirm a bit. Jesus sends his disciples out two by two to proclaim the Kingdom, and he instructs them "to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics." When I travel I tend to make sure I have everything I need: plenty of clothes, my computer, my phone, credit cards, money for emergencies, etc., etc. And I am reminded of a meditation I often read that has a line from Dorothy Day, who says, "The only way to live in any true security is to live so close to the bottom that when you fall you do not have far to drop, you do not have much to lose." Yet I, and society in general, tend to look for security in more and more possessions, not less. We call those who have lots of money "successful". Perhaps this gospel could spur each of us to look at where we find security, and where we place our priorities.

And we are in the midst of what is turning out to be a hot summer. In next Sunday's gospel passage Jesus tells his apostles, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." No matter our financial or employment status, I think that is valid advice for each of us. I hope and pray that each of you will be able to find some way to break the ordinariness of life, to experience a change in routine that provides refreshment and time for renewal.

Our new Vision Statement, part of our Pastoral Plan, says to "Be a beacon of mercy, service, and discipleship"—for the purpose of encountering God. I pray that freed from encumbrances of wealth and renewed by rest, as individuals and as a community, we may be that beacon in today's world.

Pastoral Plan Revisited

For a series of weeks, the bulletin will contain a brief description of one aspect of the Pastoral Priority Plan that was presented at masses on June $2^{nd}/3^{rd}$. This will help explain it, and keep it in the forefront of our minds.

Pastoral Priority 1:

"Forming Intentional Disciples"

The pastoral council completed a number of reflection exercises to assist in the development of three pastoral priorities for Assumption Parish. They discerned things they wanted to see the parish achieve, things to avoid, and things to improve to help our parish to thrive as a "beacon of mercy, service and discipleship". The first of our pastoral priorities is forming intentional disciples. What exactly is meant by the term 'intentional disciple'? Simply put, an intentional disciple is one who has a personal relationship with Christ, thus making a deep commitment to follow Jesus in the midst of his Church in order to live out God's particular mission for them in the world. The key word here is 'personal'. One must believe that God desires a personal relationship, encounter the Lord personally, and intentionally choose to nurture that personal relationship as one strives to live as a witness of Jesus. That may sound simple, but research shows that many Catholics do not believe in a personal God who loves them as an individual, let alone had such encounter moments with God that there is no longer any doubt of his personal love. Do we have many intentional disciples? Absolutely! Can we grow in that manner and draw others to intentional discipleship? Absolutely! Intentional discipleship does not allow us to be passive, but rather calls us to discern our gifts and allow the Holy Spirit to use them for the good of others. This pastoral priority to form intentional disciples can be approached in many ways, and be foundational to all we do as members of Assumption Parish. As we begin to implement this pastoral plan you will hear more about the variety of ways the Holy Spirit will help us in Forming Intentional Disciples."

"Hospitality with a twist of service" might be a quick definition of the ministry of the usher. Though ushers are truly ministers of welcome who play a significant part in the first impression a parish portrays to newcomers, they also have tasks that are important roles of service. It is with warmth, acceptance and inclusion that ushers greet people and offer assistance to find seats, or washrooms, or tend to needs for comfort, etc. With a smile and a word or nod of thanks, ushers collect our offerings, to be presented at the altar. With reverence, respect, and an eye for the needs of each person, ushers guide the movement of the congregation during communion, and preserve the sanctity of the moment by indicating with their postures and positions where our attention should be. At the end of mass, ushers make sure we receive our bulletins and whatever other assistance we might need. So while they have particular tasks to do, that are indeed a gift to the community, the way in which those tasks are done creates a sense of welcome and belonging among the people.

If you like to offer very tangible assistance by doing particular tasks, the role of the usher is worth considering. Is this a ministry you could offer, with your desire to offer 'hands on' help, as well as your people skills? If so, please prayerfully discern becoming an usher. Though summer is here, you can let Jean Beneteau know of your interest anytime. There will be an opportunity to register for various ministry teams in early Fall, with particular training for each ministry to follow.
