From The Pastors Desk...

I am constantly amazed at how often I receive abundance when I expect scarcity, although with God that is what often happens. I don't know why I'm amazed, actually, since it always seems to end up that way. This Sunday's gospel reading is the multiplication of loaves from John's Gospel, which will be followed by four Sundays of Jesus' discourse about the bread of life: God nourishing us, in the Eucharist and in all aspects of life.

We as a parish are about to experience abundance after expecting scarcity. It was hard to say goodbye to Fr. Jim, who was with us for the past three years. Yet now the Basilian Fathers have informed me that Fr. Mark Gazin, CSB, who some of you met recently, will be joining us on the Assumption Pastoral Team. Fr. Mark has just finished a degree in Canon Law at St. Paul's University in Ottawa, and is presently doing a practicum at the Tribunal of the Archdiocese of Toronto. Although you may see him in and out for a little while, he will begin ministry here at the end of August, as a part-time member of our parish team, and part-time with the Tribunal of the Diocese of London (based here in Windsor). Fr. Mark and I overlapped in the seminary by two years. His first assignment after ordination was at St. John the Baptist parish in Amherstburg, and he has served in a number of ministries since then. We are privileged to welcome him back to Essex County, this time to the great city of Windsor. Once he arrives he will tell you more about himself.

And August 11 and 12 will be another experience of abundance. Mr. Paul Mullins will present his preliminary report of the study he has been doing of previous fundraising campaigns at Assumption and possible future directions. This first report will explain fully what has transpired with the two previous fundraising efforts and a second report will lay out options for the future. He will give a summary of his report after each Mass on the 11th and 12th. I encourage you to come to a meeting in the parish hall at 10 AM (between the 9 and 11 o'clock Masses) to hear in more detail what he has to say.

And of course, August is the month of our Patronal Feast, the Solemnity of Our Lady of the Assumption. This year I hope to see lots of you at our Parish Picnic on Sunday, August 12, beginning around noon. We'll have food and fun for everybody. Then on the 14th we will premier the Salt + Light documentary on Assumption at 8:30 PM inside Assumption Church. The feast day itself, August 15, will see the church open from 8:30 AM to 6:00 PM, followed by a Mass in Rosary Chapel at 6. See the flyer for much more detail.

Pastoral Plan Revisited

For a series of weeks, the bulletin will contain a brief description of one aspect of the Pastoral Priority Plan that was presented at masses on June $2^{nd}/3^{rd}$. This will help explain it, and keep it in the forefront of our minds.

Pastoral Priority 2: "Outreach to Family and Community"

During the discernment of three pastoral priorities for Assumption Parish, the pastoral council members had many common concerns and ideas for outreach to people in our local community, so that they may experience Assumption Parish as a "beacon of mercy, service and discipleship". This wide variety of perceived areas of need all fit under the more general priority statement "Outreach to Family and Community". It includes the wonderful ministries of outreach to the poor that already function so beautifully such as both St. Vincent de Paul conferences, the work of the mission club, haircuts for the homeless, etc, and includes new ideas for service to those in need in different ways. Plans for partnering with local community service and action groups may be a fruit from this pastoral priority, as well as offering the spiritual supports people may be seeking. Outreach to newcomers to the community, and care for those who may not have the ability to come to us are included under this umbrella. Also, of great importance is our attendance to the needs of our local families, on many levels. The young families of the area are truly the people who will carry the mission of Assumption Parish into the future. We need to know them, support them, empower them and equip them, as well as welcome them into the life of our parish community. As we "Form Intentional Disciples" we will become stronger in our "Outreach to Family and Community", thus furthering our growth as a "Beacon of mercy, service and discipleship" in the community.

"Hospitality from the pew" is a calling of all the baptized. As we gather to share in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, we should be mindful that the real presence of Jesus is present to us, in and through, the people gathered to receive him. All of us should be intentional about offering Christ-like hospitality to those we see around us at mass. However, the ministry of greeting from the pew can also be organized as a specific parish ministry of those with particular gifts of hospitality. Here area a few suggestions from Rev. Richard Kaley OFM Conv., a pastor from Bloomington MN, on what pew hospitality might look like.

- Sit in the middle of the pew so others don't have to climb over you to find a seat.
- Greet people as they enter and sit all around you with a few simple words, smiles, nods or pleasant gestures. At the sign of peace, say your name and ask theirs, and use it at the end of mass to say good-bye.
- Strike up casual conversation at the end of mass as you are exiting.
- As you make your way out, introduce yourself to someone you do not yet know.
- When standing with two people you know, ask if they know each other and if not, introduce them.
- Make it a practice to speak to someone new every weekend.
- Be intentional about sitting in different areas of the church to meet the people you do not usually end up sitting beside.

If you have natural gifts for meeting people perhaps hospitality from the pew is a ministry you could offer, without having to stand at the door before and after mass. If this ministry interests you, please make Jean Beneteau aware of your interest. There will be an opportunity to register for various ministry teams in early Fall, with particular training for each ministry to follow.
