# Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time June 21, 2015



One of the things we believe about Scripture is that it is the *living* word of God. Although the words were written down many centuries ago (probably the oldest words we have were written some 3500 years ago, and the most recent date to over 1900 years.), and the events they describe took place sometimes many, many years before the writing, they are still fresh and new for us. I find that especially true with the readings this weekend and last.

I've been here at Assumption Parish for just a few weeks. Even though I have already learned so much, I am realizing that what I have learned is just scraping the surface of the reality of things. The history of the parish is complex and many-faceted. All of you still have much to teach me. People have made decisions that have had adverse effects on others. Some things may make perfect sense on paper, yet when lived out in the lives of a parish community and of individuals, they cause only questioning and hurt. And we live with the consequences.

Enter our readings: When I am completely honest with myself, I know there is a part of me that not only wants to, but believes that I am able to "fix" everything. I can come waltzing in here and heal all your hurts, and put this parish on the right track, whether that be restoring Assumption church, fixing up Holy Name of Mary/McEwan site, or whatever. Instead, I hear God saying to me the words that Job heard some 2500 years ago: "Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stopped." And the Gospel reminds me—and all of us, I think—that we can't always choose to stop the storms. Jesus, though, will get us through them. Somehow, Jesus will get us through. He is the one who will calm things. And, somehow, our faith says that God really does make all things work out for the best.






