The Parochial Vicar's Message

Pay attention to this Sunday's first reading. In the middle of bold declarations of God's deeds, Isaiah says "I have labored in vain; I have spent my strength in nothing and vanity." What an odd thing to say! Isaiah is telling everyone about how God had chosen him from his mother's womb, how God had been preparing him all his life for great things. And then, rather than expressing pride or joy at receiving God's favour, Isaiah instead admits that he is a screw-up, and that he has wasted his life.

And yet, don't we often do the same thing? We profess that we are children of God, that we are members of the bodies of Christ, that we are anointed with the Holy Spirit and empowered to be Jesus' disciples. And yet, despite knowing this, our response is not joy, but frustration at our lack of success. We can even feel that we are failures, that we have spent our strength with nothing to show for it. How is it that we can express so much admiration for God, and yet in the same breath express contempt for the work of God's hands, that work being our very selves?

Many of us were taught that pride is a sin, and that humility is a virtue. And so, in an attempt to be humble, we are often our own worse critics. It is true that we should not be too self-satisfied; God did not give us so many gifts so that we could admire ourselves all day long. God wants us to put our gifts to work! But surely we can do this without being negative about ourselves.

It may help to remember that humility does not mean that you think negative thoughts about yourself. It is healthier to think of humility as self-forgetfulness. As being the kind of person who can appreciate the positive qualities of others, but when they notice their own qualities, think only of how to put them to good use.

And remember too that God works in the long term. Isaiah did not think that he had accomplished anything, but that is because he did not see how his words would be fulfilled in Christ and inspire believers down the centuries. We too need to trust God that, although we might not see anything happening now, great things are still to come.

A hospitable parish is one that welcomes others as Jesus did, and one that welcomes all people as if they were Jesus. As Catholics we have inherited a wonderful tradition of hospitality from the Scriptures themselves, and the rich history of Catholic institutions welcoming the traveler and those in need. In these times, in our parish, with many new people arriving in our area, it is not enough to assume people know they are welcome with us. We must intentionally go out to those we do not know, engage in conversation, and build relationships. We are working on concrete plans for building relationships with people through the experiences that bring us together. We would like to sustain contact with families beyond the reception of the sacraments, and when they come to us in times of difficulty and sorrow.

However, our immediate intentional response is to welcome and encounter people at mass. Of course this includes greeters and ushers, but it also includes every one of us! Our smiles, greetings, and introductions invite others to join in and share a bit of their story with us. Gesturing an invitation to sit with us, and sharing a pleasant comment or two goes a long way in conveying to someone that they do indeed belong.

This is a great time to make a personal plan to intentionally welcome someone new to you at mass. Every effort we make will help us to grow in our spirit of hospitality as a community. You may also consider the ministries of greeter or usher, and try them on for size, prior to committing yourself for a longer period of time.

Please, if you are at mass and willing to help, come forward and let one of the current ministry leaders know of your interest and availability. It is not too soon to come forward with your interest, though training for particular hospitality ministries will not take place until the Fall. Please offer your prayer and your efforts toward our growth as a parish where all who enter feel that they belong.

Pastoral Plan Revisited

For a series of weeks, the bulletin will contain a brief description of one aspect of the Pastoral Priority Plan that was presented at masses on June 2nd/3rd. This will help explain it, and keep it in the forefront of our minds.

VALUES

The values stated in the pastoral plan address the questions: 1.) How does the parish exemplify what it stands for? 2.) How will the parish leadership make decisions that inspire its people? **3.)** How do the parish's values serve the parishioners? Through use of a values identification tool, the pastoral council prayed over, pondered, and discussed the values they see as predominant in the community and those which we desire to influence the implementation of the pastoral plan. Values are the over-arching, primary beliefs that govern the thinking and acting of a parish. The council identified a strong value for quality Worship, in a variety of forms. Another core value of Assumption Parish is our attention to justice and service, particularly outreach to the poor and the missions. The third value listed, Forming Disciples, is one that identifies the high value placed on our growing awareness of our baptismal call and place in the mission of God. This includes ongoing faith formation for all, small group sharing, evangelization and outreach, and all we do to help one another fulfill our purpose to Encounter God. These values will influence how we live out the vision for the future.
