Lent

From the Pastor's Desk...

When I was a novice we attended a workshop on Centring Prayer, taught by a Trappist Monk, Basil Pennington. Fr. Pennington taught us that the basic intent of this method is to listen to God-nothing more, nothing less. You just try to sit and "be" in God's presence. From that time on I would do 20 minutes of centring on an occasional basis. Fast-forward many years, to shortly after I was assigned to Most Holy Trinity parish in Angleton, Texas, and met with Sr. Adeline, who had been recommended to me for spiritual direction. We talked for a while, and then she asked me about my prayer life. I said that in addition to Mass and community prayer, I usually did Centring. When she asked how often, I said, "most mornings". She asked if I did it in the afternoons as well, and I told her I didn't. She said, "Well, I'm going to insist: twice a day!" I had never had anyone be that directive before, and she was the catalyst I needed to begin that twice-a-day practice. It made a difference in my life. Fast-forward again a few years, and when I moved to Edmonton the afternoon prayer time just kind of faded away. Then when I moved to Windsor, the morning one went away as well, until about a year-and-a-half ago, when I restarted the morning centring times, but the afternoons were still quite elusive. Then about three months ago I started a regular afternoon session once again. And, just like several years ago back in Texas, I started noticing differences.

Then just a few weeks ago I was at a convention that I attend annually. I had to give a workshop that included a segment on prayer, and I talked about my meditation practice. When I said that a few months earlier I had restarted afternoon meditation time, one of the guys there said, "That's what it is!" He told me that he noticed a "light in my eyes", and a kind of calmness that was totally absent when he saw me a year earlier. I was so surprised to hear him say this, that there would be any kind of tangible difference in how I am.

So, why am I telling you all this? In this weekend's gospel passage, God's voice tells Peter, James, and John to listen to Jesus. *We, as Christians, are called to listen.* And to listen takes humility. It is so easy to want to be in control; it is easy to let the noise of the world drown out God's voice. And yet when I take the time to really listen for God, I start to hear God's voice in so many other places. This Lent we are talking about *Attitude Adjustment*, about the virtue of humility. Humility often starts by being quiet and listening, to God and to others. Might you just want to add some listening time to your Lenten practices?
