## **All Saints** November 1st, 2015



This weekend the Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints. We celebrate FROM THE those myriads of people who will never PASTOR'S DESK be officially canonized by the Church, yet

who we know in our hearts are in the presence of God. We celebrate that about which John speaks in our second reading this weekend, in a reading especially meaningful to me because it was one of the readings at my ordination: See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. He goes on to say that we are already God's children, and vet even more will be revealed. Those are powerful words. I rarely live up to them (which is one reason I need the Sacrament of Reconciliation). Even so, God can work through my flaws, and is offering me salvation.

This past Sunday the Synod of Bishops on the Family came to an end. In his homily at the closing Mass, Pope Francis reminded us of how we need to be bothered by the situations of others, and open to all the surprises God has for us along the way. During the three weeks of the Synod, Pope Francis and many of the bishops and cardinals present spoke of the need to do what we can to make the Church a place of welcome and healing, especially for those who are cut off from the sacramental life. In the coming months Pope Francis will issue a document summarizing his thoughts and orienting the Church along the paths laid out by the bishops. If what has been said so far is any indication, there will be no changes in official teaching of the Church. There probably will be, however, a way to make it easier to receive God's mercy, to be reconciled, to be welcomed.

Here at Assumption Parish, gathered as we are at Holy Name of Mary church, you will notice a few changes. Any changes I have authorized, and any that will come in the future, are meant to help us all to become better disciples and able to worship more easily. With that in mind, we have rearranged the pews to allow people to more easily pray before the tabernacle (and give the choirs even more room to make beautiful music to the Lord!). I thank Tim and Kevin and Sr. Lise and Greg, who have worked so hard on this. And Kevin Mannara has designed and installed banners of welcome that we see on entering the church, and some that encourage us to be disciples as we exit. I pray that we all be inspired as we leave the church, strengthened by the Eucharist, to truly be saints in this world.

This Tues. evening November 3 our parish's monthly discernment group will be meeting at the rectory for dinner and discussion on service to the Church.


