THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

November 11, 2012



1 Kings 17:10-16; Ps. 146; Hebrews 9:24-28; Mark 12:38-44

Today's gospel contrasts counterfeit devotion with true generosity, Jesus warns about those who exploit their position of religious leadership. Lengthy prayers cannot make amends for exploitation of the helpless. Jesus, whose ministry was supported by the contributions of women (see Luke 8:1-3) noticed that the rich gave to God only from their surplus, while a poor widow contributed everything she had. Her offering was the more noteworthy because widows at that time were especially ulnerable—they did not inherit

vulnerable—they did not inherit their husband's estate. In the first reading, another poor widow, a pagan at that, shares with God's prophet the last morsel of food she has for herself and her son. God is not outdone in generosity, and her food supply lasts until the famine ends. The generosity of these two widows is like God's generosity in giving us everything he had, Jesus; Jesus in turn showed us what God is like by offering himself for our sins. He continues to pray for us in God's presence.



UPDATE ON THE RESTORATION PROJECTS

In the last few weeks we have made some progress on church maintenance. We're not ready to call it restoration yet, but work has been done to ensure the safety of parishioners and the public. A new tem-

porary catwalk was built in the attic so that workers could get to the far corners of the church where the roof meets the walls. They report that the roof is safe. The outside walls have been scraped to remove loose brick and stone. A fence has been begun around the perimeter of the church to protect passersby from any chips of brick or stone that might fall. The clutter in the basement of the church filled a very large waste bin. The floor under the sanctuary has been reinforced so that Fr. Bill doesn't fall through. An engineering company has been engaged to examine the heating system and suggest changes to improve its functioning. We had a visit from our insurance providers who gave us a favourable report. A plaster specialist will examine the ceiling this week and give a report.

A parish fundraising committee has been established and is working on several possibilities which will come to light over the coming year.

Many thanks to all our parking lot employees who made us a profit of over \$26,000 in September and \$34,000 for October. All these monies will go toward church restoration.

Windsor Fire inspected the parking lot and declared it adequate for access to both the church and the university.
