his past Tuesday, September 29, we FROM THE celebrated the Feast of Sts. Michael, Gabriel, PASTOR'S DESK and Raphael, and honoured law enforcement personnel. St. Michael is the patron saint of

police. For me, the mere fact that police exist is a sign of contradiction: it is both hope and a testimony to sin. The police officers I know personally (and most police) join the force because they want to do good. They want to be a presence of safety and stability. They want you and me to be safe. They want to make a positive difference in the world. Yet the mere fact that they exist is a testimony of the reality that sin exists: There are those who make life unsafe for others; sometimes they inflict harm, or try to. And we need somebody to protect us, to restrain those who may harm. It is part of the inherent conflict that is our world: God created the world to be good. It is good, and yet sin has also entered, so the good is deformed at times. We need those who offer safety and stability.

In the gospel passage this weekend, Jesus speaks forcefully about marriage; yet the reality in today's society testifies to the presence of sin here, too. I'm quite confident that most people who enter into marriage do so with the firm intention that it last for life. For some, though, other issues enter in and the marriage breaks up. It is a sign that the world is not perfect. It also offers us a challenge: I must uphold the ideal; I must recognize the good that is God's creation, the good that God wills for me. And, when sin enters into the picture and the ideal is deformed, I am called to respond with mercy and compassion, just like God does. And, like a little child, I must continue to love and accept. Only then will I inherit the Kingdom of God.

I pray that Assumption be known as a place of mercy and welcome.


