From The Pastors Desk...

As a good Catholic growing up in the 1950s and 60s I learned that Catholicism was the *only* way I was going to get to heaven. We had the truth and nobody else did. While I continue to believe that we as Catholics have, as the Second Vatican Council put it, the fullness of truth, the Council also said that other religions and Christian denominations share in that truth, each in their own way. I always think of that when I return to the Holy Land, that magical place where God chose to become a human being, a living, breathing part of human history. Christians of every denomination, as well as Muslims and Jews are drawn to this special place. We hear lots of talk about endless conflict, years of struggle, etc. In truth, politics and religion become intermingled and one is often used to justify the other. Of course, each party sees itself at the one whose politics and religion are correct.

In this weekend's gospel passage we hear about someone casting out demons in Jesus' name, even though he was not one of the disciples. John wants to stop him. Jesus responds: "Do not stop him; for no one who does a deed of power in my name will be able soon afterward to speak evil of me. Whoever is not against us is for us." On this trip I am helping to lead a peace and justice pilgrimage, rather than working on team with Christian Peacemaker Teams, as I have done before. As you read this, our group will be in Jerusalem. On the trip we spend time in the holy sites, where Jesus was born and raised, taught, healed, died, and rose. Perhaps even more importantly, we meet with organizations and individuals—Israeli, Palestinian, and international, made up of Christians, Muslims, and Jews—working for peace and for a just resolution to the situation there. Who has the right answer? I think any and all of these people, if working for justice and following Jesus' example of nonviolence, are "in the right" and further the coming of God's kingdom.

Closer to home we can apply the same principles, whether for the people running for elected office, or the many, many more who serve others. Do we Catholics do it best? Can a Muslim govern effectively? How about an atheist? Let us pray that all our brothers and sisters, no matter what their allegiance, may work in society according to Jesus' principles.

Pastoral Plan Revisited—For a series of weeks, the bulletin will contain a brief description of one aspect of the Pastoral Priority Plan. This will help explain it, and keep it in the forefront of our minds.

Foundational Ministries: Foundational Ministries are the essential ongoing work of the parish which most often remain stable and consistent

"Governance and Finance"

The fifth foundational ministry is that of the parish's call to stewardship through good governance and financial responsibility. This involves good communication with parishioners regarding our financial status and the leadership decisions that are made which effect parish life. Assuring the safety and well-being of all the people, especially the most vulnerable is a vital piece of this foundational ministry. Our pastoral plan calls for us to update and completely implement the diocesan program regarding those who serve in any ministries of the parish, entitled "Called, Gifted and Sent". The hope was to have this completed by the end of September, but the Diocese has made adaptations to the program that will not be presented to staff until November. Updating our information on those who serve in the parish is an ongoing effort and will continue to be updated while we wait to hear what changes have been made. Then we will proceed according to the adapted policies and procedures of the Diocese to protect and ensure the safety and well-being of all, including those who serve in each ministry. A second goal set by the council under this heading is 'to have a yearly meeting of the Pastoral Council, the pastoral team, and the finance committee, and to communicate the fruits of that meeting to the parishioners. This will remind us all to clearly communicate the positive growth and the challenges we face to the community. Along with committing to conversation among the council, staff and finance committee, the pastoral plan includes a goal to 'develop a communication strategy for all parish groups/committees/ministries by the beginning of 2019'. It is obviously a high priority of the council that we establish transparent and honest communication systems that will help draw us together as a community, as we strive for collaboration among all our ministry groups. We do not want to offer ministry in 'silos', but work collaboratively in service of the mission of God and our vision to 'be a beacon of mercy, service and discipleship' in the larger community.
