It was a joy to see so many people in church and to notice that they left with rosy cheeks and a smile on their faces. Everyone helped, thank you.

A NEW YEAR, A NEW BEGINNING

As we turn the calendar to a new year, many of us feel the familiar mixture of gratitude, hope, and perhaps a touch of weariness from the year just completed. There is something undeniably refreshing about a clean page, a new start, a chance to begin again. A good friend recently shared with me a delightful and profound line from G.K. Chesterton that captures this beautifully: "The object of a New Year is not that we should have a new year. It is that we should have a new soul and a new nose; new feet, a new backbone, new ears and new eyes."

Chesterton reminds us that the true promise of a new year is not found in the number changing on our phones or calendars. It is found in the renewal of the human person—in the possibility that God can make us new from the inside out. We do not need to wait for life's circumstances to change before we begin again; grace allows us to begin again right now

When Chesterton writes of a *new soul*, he isn't imagining that we discard who we are and start from scratch. Rather, he invites us to open our hearts more fully to God's transforming love. A "new soul" is a heart refreshed by forgiveness, a spirit strengthened by trust, and a renewed awareness that God walks with us into every chapter of life.

To have a *new nose* may sound odd, but Chesterton is getting at something deeply spiritual: the ability to "smell" what is good, holy, and life-giving. Many of the saints speak of developing a kind of instinct for grace—a sensitivity to the presence of God in the ordinary. Perhaps this year we can pray to become more alert to the subtle fragrances of God's work around us: a moment of peace, an unexpected kindness, a chance to help someone in need.

New feet suggest a willingness to walk new paths, especially ones that lead us closer to Christ and toward those who need us. It might mean stepping away from habits that drain our joy or making more intentional time for prayer, for family, or for those who are hurting. New feet give us courage to move in the direction of God's invitations.

A new backbone is Chesterton's way of saying that renewal sometimes requires strength, moral courage, resilience, and perseverance. The Christian life is not always easy, but it is always accompanied by grace. A new year invites us to stand a little straighter in our faith, trusting that God's strength is made perfect in our weakness.

Finally, new ears and new eyes: the ability to hear God's Word more deeply and to see others and ourselves with greater compassion. Perhaps the greatest gift we can receive this year is the grace to look at the world with the eyes of Christ, seeing not only its challenges but also its possibilities, its beauty, and the goodness still unfolding.

As a parish family, may this New Year be more than a change of date. May it be a season of renewal in mind, heart, and spirit. Let us welcome the grace that makes all things new and step forward with hope, trusting that God is already ahead of us, preparing the way.

Lord, make this year not merely new in number, but new in transformation. Shape us, guide us, and walk with us, so that our lives may reflect the love of Christ more clearly. Bless our parish, our families, and all we hold in prayer. May Your peace go before us, Your grace sustain us, and Your joy be our strength. Amen.
