

October 2024 Updates

Parish Feast

On **Sunday, October 20th**, St. Margaret Mary Parish will celebrate the feast of its patroness. For this special occasion, we have invited our former pastor and the current Ordinary of the Diocese of St. Catharines, Bishop Gerard Bergie. His Excellency will preside and deliver the Word of God at the 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM Masses. After each Eucharist (as well as after the Saturday evening Mass), all are invited to the parish hall for refreshments and fellowship. Tea, coffee, and delicious Polish donuts from Sweet Temptation in Toronto will be served. We look forward to celebrating together! *St. Margaret Mary, pray for us!*





Wednesday Morning Mass with Students

Starting on October 23rd, our church will begin celebrating an additional Eucharist every Wednesday at 9:00 AM, with the students of St. Margaret Mary Elementary School in attendance. This additional Mass time will also be suitable for parishioners who prefer to attend a later morning service. During these Masses, the students will have the opportunity to deepen their faith, learn about the Mass, and strengthen their relationship with God. All are welcome to attend this Mass.

Church Lights Update

Changing the church ceiling lights cost \$22,649,89. Changing the light switch panel and breakers panel cost \$20,073.73. The total cost of the project was \$42,723.62. The 2023 Bazaar profit of \$11,845.39 went towards these expenses. Thank you for the financial support of this great investment.

Candles

The state of hardware, such as candle sticks, nylon shells, wicking, and sockets was like that of many older churches, in need of upgrades. To address these issues, the church has acquired new, secure-fitting sockets, shells, and high-quality processional candles and altar candles.

The chosen products burn soot-free liquid premium-grade paraffin with meager operating costs. They also have wicks that require no trimming or pulling and can be changed without a tool. These features will reduce operating costs, eliminate staining and dripping, and ease maintenance. The purity of the grade-one liquid paraffin will result in clean furniture, walls, and ceilings, negating the need for future cleaning and painting for many years.

Like many older churches, ours faced several issues related to church hardware and the use of electric candles that needed attention. The old Altar Candles and Acolytes were quite unsightly and weathered. The Altar Candles were sitting on top of the Altar, resulting in less space available on the Altar.

The new candle type fills the need for Altar Candles and processional candlelight. The candle shells were selected for several reasons.

- a) The shells are fabricated from a solid nylon rod, resulting in the desired length and diameter to display proportionately and suit our visual needs, and for ease of cleaning, refilling, wick changing, and better economy.
- (b) Utilizing solid machined nylon makes for a beautiful leak-proof shell for an unlimited lifetime of service, and any fingerprints or smudges come clean with a damp cloth and mild soap.
- (c) Refilling with a pump kit and squeeze bottle allows drip-free replenishment of the pure, grade-one liquid paraffin.
- (d) Top-quality liquid paraffin means no smell, no stains, and no dripping.
- (e) The liquid paraffin system requires no trimming, pulling, or changing of wicks unless a candle wick is burned dry. That way, the wick can be easily replaced.



The factory settings of the wicks should be left undisturbed. In any case, no tools are required.

In summary, the changes made will result in a clean, soot-free, allergen-free, and toxin-free burn with a very low-cost, low-maintenance system that will last for decades.

The cost to the church, including shipping and tax, is \$10,464.31, including an initial fuel supply. An anonymous donor donated \$2,890.00 towards this project. Any donation to help pay off the debt from the purchase of new candles is appreciated.

Mass Intentions Request Form

the Parish office begins accepting other parishioners' intentions. At this time, we are only accepting Mass intentions for the couple celebrating their wedding anniversary.

(2) Requests for all other Mass intentions will start being accepted during the first week of October.

You may request your Mass intentions by filling out the form and presenting it to the parish office. Forms are available on the parish website and in the narthex. Intentions are not accepted over the phone.
