Covid Retrictions – Because of the rise in Covid cases, there are new restrictions in place until at least May 20th. By law, we must restrict attendance inside the church to 10 people. Sadly, due to these measures, by order of the Cardinal, Masses are temporarily cancelled. Priests will continue to celebrate private Masses for the intentions of parishioners and for those suffering from the corona virus. The church is open for private prayer during normal times, but again, only 10 people are allowed in the church at any one time. The 10: 30am Mass on Sunday mornings will continue to be live streamed on our parish website: www.stpp.church.

On Saturdays, there will be confessions from 4:30pm to 5:00pm followed by Communion Services from 5-6pm. On Sunday, there will be Communion Services from 11:30am to 1:00pm, with 10 people at a time. We will continue to update you as the situation evolves. You can check on our website or on Instagram. This is a very difficult sacrifice we are making for the greater good. We pray that all of us will remain safe and healthy during this time.

Confirmation: Because of the Covid restrictions, all Confirmations up until and including May 21st are postponed. Hopefully, we can reschedule them for June. Information will be sent through the schools. The Confirmations for May 25th and 28th may still be celebrated as long as the restrictions are lifted by May 20/21. We will have to see.

A Prayer for the Poor and Homeless

We place before you the people who are forced into public shelters because they were evicted from their homes, because they have no money to rent adequate space, because they are ill and help is remote.

Sow the seeds of justice in the hearts of all people of faith. Let hope flourish where there is despair. Let compassion bring charity and a real sharing of the good gifts of the earth. Humble the powerful and the rich. Give courage to single parents and those who are alone.

The Celebration Goes On - with Easter Day comes life, light and joy. Jesus' death was not the end. He came to earth to give His life, in order to make peace between God and us and to bring the whole universe back to God. His rising to life proved that he had won the battle against sin, darkness and death, once and for all. become the Kingdom of our Lord and of His Christ, and He shall reign for ever and ever". So the celebration that began at Easter will never end.
