The entire region of York is in a State of Emergency because of the increase in infections. The present lockdown is supposed to last until February 19/21. A Guide to St. Padre Pio Church

THE OUTSIDE OF THE CHURCH

Standing outside the large central doors, you can see a cross on the doors. This is reminder that it is through Jesus, we enter the church. He is the 'door'. In front, there is a Prayer Garden. At the centre of the garden is a bronze statue of St. Padre Pio. Benches are placed near the statue so that people can pray with St. Padre Pio. The four walls in the garden contain the mysteries of the Rosary – the Joyful Mysteries, the Luminous Mysteries, the Sorrowful Mysteries and the Glorious Mysteries. This is the Rosary Walk.

In sacred architecture, there is an invisible line, called the sacred-axis, which in our case goes from the outside statue of St. Padre Pio, through the central doors, into the Narthex, through the baptismal font, down the centre aisle, to the altar and the statue of the Risen Christ. Now along the south side of the church are the fifteen outdoor Stations of the Cross. The two large towers contain an electronic carillon which rings out the Angelus at 12 noon and 6pm, as well as a hymn at 6:45pm every day.

At the rear of the church, there is an outdoor Shrine to Mary, with the statue of Mother and Child being dedicated to the unborn. Near the Shrine, will be the future amphitheatre. Past the area of the amphitheatre there is a plaque in honour of St. Jean de Brebeuf, who actually passed through this area, and another small prayer garden with a large standing Cross, where people can literally bring their problems to the Cross.

"I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride dressed for her husband. Then I heard a loud vice call from the throne, 'Look, here God lives among human beings. He will make His home among them; they will be His people, and He will be their God; His name is God-withthem.'"
