
WELCOME BACK TO OUR TEACHERS, STUDENTS AND PARISHIONERS RETURNING AFTER SUMMER BREAK

JOURNEYING TOWARD FULL COMMUNION – THE RCIA PROCESS



Are you—or someone you know—thinking about becoming Catholic? The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the Church's pathway for welcoming new members into the faith. It's not a program, but a spiritual journey that unfolds in four stages that are marked by rites:

Period of Inquiry (Pre-Catechumenate)

This is a time for seekers to ask questions, explore the teachings of the Church, and discern their calling. There's no commitment yet—just curiosity and conversation. When ready, participants celebrate the Rite of Acceptance, becoming official catechumen or candidate for full initiation into the Catholic faith, if they are already baptized in another Christian faith.

Period of the Catechumenate

During this period, the journey deepens. Catechumens (those not yet baptized) and candidates (already baptized in another Christian tradition) engage in regular formation, prayer, and community life. This period typically lasts several months and concludes with the Rite of Election (for those not baptized), held on the First Sunday of Lent. This

Rite is usually celebrated with the Bishop at the Cathedral Basilica in Hamilton on the First Sunday in Lent.

Period of Purification and Enlightenment

Coinciding with Lent, this stage is a time of spiritual preparation for the Easter sacraments. The Elect participate in special rites called Scrutinies, receive the Creed and the Lord's Prayer, and prepare for full initiation at the Easter Vigil, where they receive Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

Period of Mystagogy

After Easter, the newly initiated continue their journey during the Easter season, reflecting on the mysteries they've received and becoming more deeply integrated into parish life. This period culminates at Pentecost but marks the beginning of lifelong discipleship.

Whether you are unbaptized, baptized in another Christian tradition, or a baptized Catholic seeking to complete your sacraments of initiation, the RCIA is open to all. The process is set to begin in October.
