

## UPHOLDING THE SANCTITY OF LIFE IN THE FACE OF MAID

In recent years, Canada's expansion of Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) has stirred deep concern among faith communities. While framed as a compassionate option for those suffering, MAiD raises profound moral and spiritual questions that challenge our understanding of human dignity, suffering, and the role of the Church.

Why MAiD is Unacceptable from a Christian Viewpoint Life is sacred for everyone: Scripture teaches that life is a gift from God, and only He has the authority over its beginning and end. MAiD, which involves intentionally ending a life, contradicts this divine principle.

**Suffering has meaning:** While pain is never desirable, Christian tradition holds that suffering can be redemptive and spiritually transformative. Offering support and presence during suffering affirms the value of every life.

**Vulnerable lives are at risk:** Reports show that some individuals seek MAiD not because of irremediable illness, but due to poverty, loneliness, or lack of adequate care2. This reflects a failure of society—not a justification for ending life.

It's a slippery ethical slope: The expansion of MAiD to include those with mental illness (delayed until 2027) has sparked concern among psychiatrists and ethicists, who warn that irremediability in mental health is often unpredictable.

#### What Can We do to discourage MAiD?

**Promote palliative care:** Advocate for compassionate, holistic care that addresses physical, emotional, and spiritual suffering. Support organizations that provide hospice services and end-of-life care.

**Offer pastoral support:** Ensure that those facing illness or despair are not alone. Church visitation, prayer groups, and spiritual counseling can be lifelines for those in crisis.

**Educate with love:** Host forums and Bible studies that explore the ethics of life and death from a Christian lens. Equip congregants to speak thoughtfully and respectfully about MAiD.

**Engage in advocacy**: Write to elected officials urging better safeguards and increased funding for mental health, disability support, and elder care. Let our voices reflect the compassion of Christ.

**Be present:** Sometimes, the most powerful witness is simply showing up. A listening ear, a warm meal, or a shared prayer can remind someone that their life matters.

As followers of Christ, we are called to be defenders of life, especially when it is most fragile. Let us respond to the rise of MAiD not with condemnation, but with compassion, courage, and conviction—offering hope where the world offers despair.
