### A REMINDER ABOUT SUMMER MASS TIMES

For the last few years in the parish the practice has been to transition to one mass time during the summer on Sunday morning.

After some consultation, I have decided to maintain our regular mass schedule throughout the summer to better serve our parishioners. Therefore, our current schedule will be maintained, and Lord's Day masses will continue to be celebrated on Saturday at 5:00 p.m. and Sunday at 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. throughout July and August.

Although this means a greater commitment on the part of our liturgical ministers and our mass attendance may be smaller at the Sunday morning Masses, I have always believed the Mass schedule should be consistent throughout the entire year.

I hope parishioners will find the retention of this schedule convenient and helpful in maintaining your commitment to the Eucharist at the times you are most accustomed to attending.

# ANNUAL MISSION CO-OPERATIVE APPEAL JUNE 14-15, 2025

Inserted in the bulletin this weekend is a donation envelope for this appeal. PLEASE DO NOT MAKE DONATIONS DIRECTLY TO THE SISTER, as all donations must be channeled through the parish. Because this is a cooperative plan, donations are received by the parish and forwarded to the Diocese Cooperative who is responsible for dispersing funds to the missions. Tax receipts are issued by the parish at the beginning of the new year for all donations.

PLEASE MAKE ALL CHEQUES PAYABLE TO HOLY ROSARY PARISH and indicate the cheque is for the Mission Cooperative Appeal.

Parishioners may use the envelope inserted in the bulletin or use the pink VISITOR'S ENVELOPE. If you wish a tax receipt please put your envelope number on the envelope. Donations can also be made through the Donate Now button on our parish website or through Pre-Authorized Debiting.

### **FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS**

In the front entrance of the church are some pamphlets containing information about arranging funerals and the Diocesan Policy regarding the disposition of cremated remains. These pamphlets outline the purpose of the Catholic funeral rites which normally include a prayer vigil, the liturgy of Christian Burial (with or without mass) and the prayers at the cemetery.

All arrangements should be discussed with the parish priest, ideally before planning at the funeral home or by the family. This is to ensure that the family are served spiritually and pastorally and to ensure that family understands the nature of the funeral rites and options available to them. The funeral rites are designed to help people properly mourn the loss of those they love, while respecting human dignity.

We also request that arrangements for musicians be arranged through our parish office, to ensure that we follow the contractual obligations that are in place with our Music Director for the provision of music at all liturgies

### PARISH VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

In the main entrance of the church we have placed Volunteer Forms and Ministries Descriptions that outline the various ministries and volunteer opportunities in the parish. We are always in need of volunteers in the parish and there are opportunities to join social and activity groups.

Over the summer months, we encourage all parishioners to take hope a copy of this material and consider volunteering in the parish. There is something there for people of all ages.

Getting involved in a ministry is fundamental to our mandate to be disciples of Christ. It helps us to be engaged in our faith and to learn by participation. Training for ministries is provided on the Diocesan and parish level in the Fall.



# JUNE IS THE MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART

The Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus takes place in June, and thus June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart. The Sacred Heart is a symbol "of the Christian faith that is especially dear

to ordinary people as well as to mystics and theologians, because it expresses the 'good news' of love in a simple and authentic way, encapsulating the mystery of Incarnation and Redemption.

The Sacred Heart reminds us that Christ is not God simply appearing as man; He is truly man, just as He is truly God. As Pope Benedict put it, "From the boundless horizon of His love, God entered the limitations of history and of the human condition. He took a body and a heart so that we can contemplate and encounter the infinite in the finite, the invisible and ineffable Mystery in the human Heart of Jesus of Nazareth." In that encounter, we feel the presence of Christ's heart within our own.

# A NOTE ABOUT PASTORAL REFERENCES

I am happy to provide references for those seeking employment or renewing contracts within the Catholic school system. I am also happy to provide references of suitability for those who are seeking to be godparents or confirmation sponsors.

To help determine suitability for these roles, those seeking reference letters must be registered parishioners. For spiritual roles such as godparents or confirmation sponsors certain requirements must be met. It is important that parents and those to be confirmed understand these requirements before appointing godparents or sponsors. These requirements are clearly outlined in the information that is provided at the time of application or registration for these sacraments.

In some cases, people who have moved away from their parental home have not registered separately from their parents. It is important that those living apart from parents register on their own. This helps us to serve you more effectively and provide better pastoral care.
