

WORLD DAY OF PEACE: The 59th World Day of Peace will be celebrated on January 1, 2026. **"Peace Be With You All: Towards an Unarmed and Disarming Peace"** is the theme for the 2026 World Day of Peace. This theme, according to the statement from the Vatican Press Office, *"invites humanity to reject the logic of violence and war, to embrace an authentic peace, based on love and justice."* The statement continues: "It is a peace that is unarmed — that is, not based on fear, threats, or weapons; and disarming, because it is capable of dissolving conflicts, opening hearts, and generating trust, empathy, and hope. It is not enough to invoke peace; it must be embodied in a lifestyle that rejects all forms of violence, visible or structural."

"The greeting of the risen Christ, 'Peace be with you' (cf. Jn 20:19), is an invitation to all — believers, nonbelievers, political leaders, and citizens — to build the kingdom of God and to construct together a humane and peaceful future," the statement concludes.

The World Day of Peace was instituted by Pope Paul VI, who proposed it on Dec. 8, 1967, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. The Church first celebrated it on Jan. 1, 1968, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God.
