Baptism - Infants and young children of parishioners are baptized on Sunday afternoons, except during the Season of Lent. From the Pastor's Desk

When Jesus begins his public ministry, it starts not in comfort or applause, but in response to darkness and loss. John the Baptist has been arrested, and Jesus withdraws to Galilee—a place often overlooked and dismissed. Yet it is precisely there that the light begins to shine. Matthew tells us that Jesus fulfills Isaiah's prophecy: *"The people who sit in darkness have seen a great light."* God chooses ordinary places and ordinary people to reveal his saving work. God isn't working only in remote areas or in a distant time in the past, but rather in the ordinary, and in our every day lives. This Gospel reminds us that discipleship begins where we are. Jesus meets us in the midst of our routines, our struggles, and even our darkness, and invites us to follow him. Like the first disciples, we are called to leave behind whatever keeps us from trusting fully, and to walk in the light of Christ, who still proclaims the kingdom and brings healing to those in need.

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (also known as “the Atrium”) is a parish-based ministry at Holy Cross Parish. It is open to all children between the ages of 3 – 13, offering them a unique opportunity for faith development. This program, founded in Rome, is a soundly traditional method of allowing children to enter more fully into the mystery of God using the principles of Montessori education. Sleep Disorders Awareness

Sleep disorders involve difficulties with the quality, timing, or amount of sleep, leading to daytime distress and difficulty functioning. They often occur alongside medical conditions or mental health conditions, such as depression, anxiety, or cognitive disorders. Research indicates that up to one-third of Canadians don't get enough sleep. Common sleeping disorders include insomnia, sleep apnea, and narcolepsy. **Key Statistics:** adults aged **35-64** are most likely to experience insufficient sleep; **21% of car accidents** are linked to lack of sleep; regularly sleeping under **6 hours** increases the risk of coronary heart disease by 48%; **30% of Canadians** experience insomnia, and 2.2% have obstructive sleep apnea; lack of sleep is tied to chronic stress, with **36.3%** of short sleepers reporting **chronic depression**. **Healthy Sleep Habits:** avoid caffeine, alcohol, and nicotine before bed; keep a consistent sleep schedule; reduce noise and distractions; limit naps to 30 minutes; exercise regularly; and practice relaxation techniques like meditation or yoga. 3. Access multilingual support
4. Learn about symptoms, medications, chronic conditions, mental health concerns, and more
