

The Family of Parishes **Our Transition Team Has Been Formed**

Our Family of Parishes will be activated in July 2022 and will include, St. Peter's Cathedral Basilica, St. Michael's Parish and St. Josephine Bakhita African Caribbean Catholic Community. Nothing will change until July, but you will hear about the changes that we will have to make in order to work together as a Family of Parishes. We will be looking for your input on some of these changes in due course. Families of Parishes will create the stability needed that will allow our parishes to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ and to form intentional disciples. This is our goal; this is the mission of the Church. The transition will lead us to focus on this mission.

As we prepare for activation of our Family of Parish a Transition Team has been formed to help us plan for the July activation. The team is led by Father Daniel as the designated pastor and will be comprised of:

- the Associate Pastors: Father Christopher Pietraszko and Father Sekar Rai
- Lay Ecclesial Ministers from the Family of Parishes
- a Deacon from the Family of Parishes
- one administrative assistant
- two members from each of the Parish Pastoral Councils (PPC) in the Family (chosen by their respective PPCs) - these people would ideally end up forming a temporary PPC for the family for the first year of the new model
- and a recording secretary

Responsibilities:

- Meet regularly over the six-month preparation period
- develop a comprehensive communication plan
- Select a name for the Family of Parishes
- Develop a workable Mass time schedule
- Plan the integration of liturgical ministries and other parish committees, groups or organizations when possible
- Develop a Pastoral Plan
- Develop a personnel plan for our family.
- Discern office location(s)
- Develop an inventory of facilities and resources
- Develop a preliminary financial plan
