#### LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Pius Alejo* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Pius Alejo is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

# GOD'S MESSAGE OF HOPE IN A DIFFICULT TIME

**Note:** Now is the time to read the Book of Revelation in preparation for this upcoming presentation. It is tough slogging, to be sure, but it is the only book in all of the 73 books of the Bible that comes with a blessing to the one who reads it.

"Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of the prophecy, and blessed are those who hear and who keep what is written in it; for the time is near." (Rev. 1:3)

#### IT'S NEVER TOO LATE.... UNTIL IT IS.

We are now entering the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent which is past the midway point of this penitential season and next Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week with Palm Sunday. Perhaps you may find yourself totally unprepared for Lent let alone Easter and you're saying to yourself, "I haven't done anything since Lent began". But there is hope. It is never too late to renew your faith in a faith that <u>is</u> renewable. Lent is for the benefit of the people of the earth, not heaven, and there is still time to do

the work Lent calls us to do within ourselves: to fast, to pray and to do works of charity.

#### **FASTING**



Fasting means to go without something – a meal, a luxury, something we are fond of in our tastes that induces some level of hardship in order that we might draw our attention to the fact that emptying ourselves of self interest and self desires

creates a space – for God to fill. and this is the point of "giving up" in order that we might be "filled up" with God!

However, Lent should never be reduced to merely material things or food but with what we are willing to take on. A decision to go out to another with whom we desire reconciliation or forgiveness or to someone who needs our forgiveness is far more important than bread or money because it pertains to relationships which are part of the great commandment of Jesus to "love one another".

#### **ALMSGIVING**



This is an admittedly strange word which only seems to appear in the scriptures referring to giving money to the needy. All of us know, however, just how many hands there are reaching out in legitimate need for that commodity of trade which allows things unattainable to the poor to

be purchased. Jesus told Simon that "the poor you will have with you always", which isn't in any way, shape or form to be construed as Our Lord's prediction that poverty among people will be a norm of life among humans. Rather, Jesus, knowing the human heart, knew that there is this part of us that wants to hold on to things, to covet and to not share our goods, our money, our 'stuff'. Babies come into the world with their little hands clutched together as if to suggest that through original sin we have a selfish desire to hold onto things rather than to let go of them. The decision to part with money which represents our labour is to recognize our own blessing and be a blessing to others. And yet, as in all things spiritual, we discover in our giving that we receive something far greater, the logic and blessing of which scripture tells us "It is better to give than to receive". (Acts. 20:35b)

#### **PRAYER**



There are literally hundreds of thousands if not millions of books that have been written on the subject of prayer but they are all meaningless if they don't convey and we don't understand the truth that <u>prayer is communing with God and allowing God to commune with us.</u> It is pure privilege and the great giving and gift of our God that He chose to communicate with us through

the prophets, through the scriptures, the Church and most especially through His Son, Jesus, who taught us to pray to His Father, allowing us to do what had been up until that time the unthinkable – to call God, *our Father*! Jesus told us to ask for anything in prayer, yet prayer should never be reduced in our relationship with divinity as just asking but of seeking truth, discerning and even questioning. To thank the Lord for all His many, many blessings and gifts in our being and our hope in living with Him forever!

Yes, it is never too late.... provided we respond to God now, today, in this moment, for that is all any of us have. "If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts." (Fr.C)

#### SACRED RELICS OF THE SAINTS

Holy Family Parish, located at 91 Ribblesdale Dr. Whitby presents a teaching and exposition of Sacred Relics on Monday April 10 at 7:00 pm. Father Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross will be there with his very special ministry to teach about these holy objects. He will bring with him over 150 relics, some as old as 2000 years. Among the treasures will be relics of St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aguinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. In addition, there will also be present a portion of the veil of Our Lady, as well as one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. In the Church's history many miracles and healings have been worked in the presence of relics, and many have been healed through this ministry. You are encouraged to bring your articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members which you will be able to touch to the reliquaries as a means of intercession.
