LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Pius Alejo* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Pius Alejo is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

GOOD LEADERS, GOOD SHEPHERDS AND ME, FATHER CHARLES



Last week there were no weekday Masses or the Holy Hour on Wednesday and I wasn't available for appointments, though I put together this bulletin article the week before. I was attending the first group of days which are part of an 18-month program called *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds*, a program designed by the *Catholic Leadership Institute*. It's a new program being offered in the Archdiocese of Toronto and one that, it is intended, all priests of the Archdiocese of Toronto will end up taking.

One of the most common statements made by priests is that the seminary doesn't really prepare us for a life we will live in parishes. I would say that the statement is at least particllay true in that we are well formed in philosophy, theology and liturgical practice through seminary formation but the day-to-day life of a parish and the many varied roles fulfilled by the priest as pastor demands that the priest be directly involved and responsible for the financial, pastoral and liturgical realities of a parish. The priest is expected to wear many hats as employer, organizer, counsellor, planner, delegator, facilitator as well as being the bishop's representative in the parish.

In so many ways, priests find themselves ill prepared to some, all or any of the above mentioned roles as well as the many other demands placed upon him in his duty as pastor. With each parish assignment and role each priest brings his own personality. Our human limitations, weaknesses, strengths and personal characters mean that we all will handle different applications and challenges in different ways for good or ill.

Some priests are strong and effective pastors who are able to easily raise funds for the various realities and needs of an individual parish. Other priests may feel more challenged or inadequate in these same areas and yet may feel more comfortable in the pulpit on Sunday in giving the homily. Some priests may be great visionaries and see the needs of a parish and a plan for its fruitfulness before their eyes and work effectively to mobilize the people and resources to this end while others again may find these same gifts lacking in themselves. As well, parish life is constantly in flux with the various liturgical seasons, the sacraments as well as the constant expectations put on the pastor for diocesan programs and initiatives as well as those imposed by the government.

Yet all priests as individual human beings bring their humanity and personalities to their role. The way we handle situations, challenges, emergencies, requests and the individual needs of each distinct parish is determined in so many ways but what we're made of or what we are lacking. The program Good Leaders, Good Shepherds is designed to work with priests for the betterment of their being equipped to bring their personalities and their pastoral position to work better together both for the good of the priest and the people he is called to serve.

Using Jesus Christ the Good Shepherd as the ultimate model of leadership, *Good Leaders*, *Good Shepherds* is a world-class curriculum that celebrates and supports the ministry of Catholic priests. Given the demands of ministry and the complexity of running parishes—and for many priests, multiple parishes—effective leadership is paramount to creating and building authentic, vibrant Catholic communities. *Good Leaders*, *Good Shepherds* is designed to help priests overcome today's challenges of a diminishing number of clergy and more complex circumstances for priestly ministry.

Through formation in *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds*, priests can minimize the frustration and energy that they spend on their administrative roles, and instead, maximize the joy and time spent on the pastoral duties for which they were uniquely ordained.

Our mission is to help strengthen priestly identity, ministry, and fraternity. We believe this happens best when priests take time for themselves — in the company of one another — to learn, pray, socialize, and look to the future with hope.

Ultimately, the impact of this formation will be more holy, healthy, and happy shepherds of vibrant parish communities, leading more people to a deeper relationship with Christ.

I know I have not always chosen the right course of action or taken the right direction, and goodness knows the times I have not treated people and situations with the charity and understanding they deserved. It is my hope that this course, taken alongside other priests who like me are trying to put the universe together and make sense of things, will benefit me as a priest and all of you whom I am mandated by Christ to shepherd. Please pray for me and my brother priests who will walk this road of challenge, change and good experience.

In the 18-months ahead, understandably, I will have to cancel weekday Masses from time to time to attend the programs being held in various locations and venues. Thank you. (Fr. Charles)
