LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

The Sign of Our Salvation

In the readings for this past Tuesday we had an excellent example of what is known in the scriptures as a "type", where a prophecy or an event from the Old Testament is so perfectly mirrored in the New Testament in the Gospels. This is not rare at all but abundant in the way the two sides of the scriptures reflect the promises in the Old Testament and their fulfillment in the New Testament. The reading from the Book of Numbers told of the people complaining against Moses and against God as they wandered in the wilderness and how God's punishment on their disobedience and complaining was for poisonous snakes to bite them. The people recognized the snake bites were as a result of their sin and complaining against God who had saved them, so they come to their senses and ask Moses to intercede for them before God. Moses prayed to God who in turn told Moses to make a serpent of bronze and hang it on the crotch of a tree so that anyone who looks on that serpent will be healed of the poison.

And in the Gospel of John Jesus himself states "the Son of Man must be lifted up". The serpent of bronze would not have belonged rightly to the serpent kingdom as Jesus didn't belong to this world. Yet looking upon the bronze serpent would bring about salvation – the cure, just as looking upon Jesus on the Cross heals us from the poison of sin and death.

This is why the crucifix, and not just the cross or the risen Christ, suffices to bring about the full meaning of what Christ has done for us in the work of redemption. It is Christ on the Cross that marks our being saved; not defeat but the highest form of victory possible. The crucifix does not simply signify a



defeated man but a victorious God who went to death in our place, taking upon himself the very sins of the world; past, present and future. St. Paul himself preached powerfully about the Resurrection of Jesus in Athens after it had occurred and only made a handful of converts who said, "We will hear you again on this." He had a long time to think about what he had said to the Athenians on the road back to Corinth and once he had arrived there, he wrote; "I am resolved from now on to preach Christ and Him Crucified". The Cross without Christ cannot save and Christ without the Cross cannot save. It is in the scene depicted above that we look upon the happiest man in the world in that Jesus came into this world for this very reason - to die for sinners. The crucifix is the old and yet evernew symbol of sacrificial love, a love that only God in Christ can give - and did give to the world. Our Lent of forty days ends with this symbol and our Easter of Resurrection begins with it as well. Meditation before a crucifix helps us to think on our lives, our sin, our need for God and our need to see love realized. "Greater love than this no one has...". (Fr. Charles)
