Again, now that we've reached our goal please remember that our campaign isn't over. After this weekend and for all those who indicated on their pledge card that they needed some time to consider participating in this most worthy and historic campaign, we will follow up on our people's discernment in this regard by phone calls asking whether they have made a decision on a pledge. Also, for all the money raised above our target amount of \$390,000. our parish will keep 75% to be used toward our hiring of a full-time Youth Minister, replacement of our current church lighting for LED lighting as well as paying down the debt on our parish.

A YEAR OF MERCY IS UPON US

This past week on Tuesday December 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Pope Francis officially began the Year of Mercy by opening the Holy Doors at the Vatican. This will be a good time to think about what mercy means and why St. Faustina, a Polish nun and visionary who saw Our Lord depicted with rays of light emanating from His body and



revealing His Sacred Heart, received the message of mercy for the Church and the world in our time.

In this season of Advent, a time of hope, expectation and joy, we find a perfect launch to the turning of our minds to mercy since God is the source of all mercy. At Christmas we often see those who might only come to church once or twice a year to receive mercy whilst they are here not condemnation or judgment. This opportunity for them and all of us is to draw closer to Christ and His great message of mercy, love and peace.

St. Ambrose wrote, "Mercy, also, is a good thing, for it makes men perfect, in that it imitates the perfect Father. Nothing graces the Christian soul so much as mercy." So often when one has taken their own life we are left to wonder what has happened to their souls before Christ. Yet, as St. Augustine said, "The mercy of God may be found between the bridge and the water." Miguel de Cervantes stated that "Among the attributes of God, although they are all equal, mercy shines with even more brilliancy than justice." Mercy, in fact, goes further than justice in that while justice may stir the passions and impel one to do something, mercy is more of a challenge and yet a mandate for the Christian and indeed the citizen of the word.

Jeremy Taylor said that "If we refuse mercy here, we shall have justice in eternity." How true these words are for the Gospels are filled with stories from Jesus' own lips of those who receive mercy and then afterward turn on their fellow man in demand of them what they themselves have been forgiven but in turn show no mercy.

St. John Chrysostom said that "Mercy imitates God and disappoints Satan." Mercy is rooted in compassion for, as Alexander Pope penned;

Teach me to feel another's woe, to hide the fault I see; that mercy I to others show, that mercy show to me.

"Whoever falls from God's right hand is caught in his left", wrote Edwin Markham and what a beautiful image for us to keep in our minds as we reflect on God's great and mysterious mercy toward



The Heavenly Father is the image of mercy itself. Period. The expectation is real that we will do to others in forgiveness what we ourselves have received from the Lord. It's hard and that's precisely why this Year of Mercy can be such a valuable time if we dare seize it. This time between December 8, 2015 and November 20, 2016 is exactly 348 days (17 days short of a year) and also 99 weekends for us ourselves to experience that 'mercy known is mercy shown'.

The youth oriented study version of the Catechism of the Catholic Church states that "Christians must look after the needy of this earth with great consideration, love and perseverance. After all, on no other point will they be evaluated by Christ so decisively as on their way of treating the poor." (YouCat 449) Which brings us to the Seven Corporal Works of Mercy and the Seven Spiritual Works of Mercy.

THE SEVEN CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY

- 1. feed the hungry
- 2. give drink to the thirsty
- 3. clothe the naked
- 4. shelter the homeless
- 5. visit the sick
- 6. visit the imprisoned
- 7. to bury the dead

THE SEVEN SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY

- 1. to instruct the ignorant
- 2. to counsel the doubtful
- 3. comfort the sorrowful
- 4. admonish the sinner
- 5. bear wrongs patiently
- 6. forgive all injuries
- 7. to pray for the living and the dead

This would be a fitting and worthwhile list to keep before us throughout this Year of Mercy, examining not so much the checklist of what we are doing, which is commendable, but perhaps to pay attention to that which we tend to neglect. Our biggest enemy is time which we never seems to have enough of but also can be seized and harnessed through self-discipline and practice where we find and make time to show mercy. (Fr. C)


