LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Manuel Duterte* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Manuel is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

The following article was written by Fr. Dwight Longenecker, an American priest who is a convert first from Evangelical Christianity, then to the Church of England (Anglican) and then who became a Roman Catholic and is now a Catholic priest. As a Benedictine priest he wears a cassock, which is a long robe, tied at the waste with a rope or cincture. A few weeks ago I wrote in the bulletin

about wearing my Roman Collar as a Catholic priest and the witness it provides to others about the presence of the Church and the priesthood in the world today. The following short article reminded me of my message about dressing and being identified as a priest and how it arouses conversation and interest in some while avoidance and a dis-ease with others.

"Today on the way home from Mass I stopped at Krispy Kreme for a dozen donuts. I'm wearing my cassock and Benedictine scapular. Here's what happened.

First guy I see is about thirty. Hospital scrubs. He says, "What church are you?"

"Our Lady of the Rosary Catholic Church."

"I'm the son of two Lutheran pastors."

"I can help you with that if you like..."

Laughs. " I really like the new pope."

"Me too. What do you do. Doctor, Nurse?"

"Nurse. In the cardiac unit at St Francis."

"I was just there last week to anoint an old fellow. After the anointing he said, 'Father, it's so beautiful!' I asked what he was seeing. He said, 'Christ the King!' Then closed his eyes."

Thinks it through. Orders his coffee. "Thanks for sharing that!" I start to order my donuts. The girl says the Lutheran paid for them. Nice.

Another guy comes through the door. "What religion are you?" "Catholic. Catholic priest."

"You look real sharp in that outfit."

"Thanks. Where do you go to church?"

"Greenville Christian Fellowship. I used to be Catholic."

"That means you're still Catholic. You should come to Our Lady of the Rosary sometime."

"Maybe I'll do that."

Older woman about sixty comes through the door. She looks like an Italian grandma. I'm still picking out my donuts.

"I can't think of the last time I saw a priest in public."

"Most of them don't wear the cassock anymore."

"That's a shame. I was brought up Catholic. What parish are you Father?"

"Our Lady of the Rosary."

"Where's that?"

"At the junction of I-85 and Augusta Road, but you can't tell it's a Catholic parish because we don't have a church that looks Catholic. It's just a warehouse."

"What a shame."

"But we're doing something about that. We're building a beautiful new church that will look like a Catholic Church!"

"Wonderful! I've come back to the church because of the new pope. That other church (names one in town) what were they thinking when they built that? It looks terrible."

"I can't disagree with you. But we're building a beautiful church. Do you have a million dollars? We need more money."

"I can hardly afford the donuts, Father!"

"OK. You come see us sometime."

I love being a priest, and wearing the cassock always sparks good conversations. So many people want to love the church. They want to love Christ. They want a priest to be a priest and set a good example. We need to work with all the good spirit that is out there, and forget about the negativities.

My choice was a cup of coffee, a sour cream donut and a Boston cream donut and I'll start my diet tomorrow. I mean, if you can't celebrate Epiphany with a visit to Krispy Kreme what's the world coming to? Next thing you know they'll be abolishing Monsignors...".

HAVE A HARD TIME HEARING AT MASS?

Offertory Envelopes 2014

When you start to use your envelopes in January 2014, **you must print your full name and address on the front of each envelope for the month of January.** This allows us to enter the correct information in the parish database. Failure to do this will result in your not receiving a tax receipt for 2014.

For parishioners who have not used offertory envelopes before, and wish to do so, please complete a parish registration form at the Welcome Table in the church vestibule and there you will receive your box of envelopes.

Parishioners who are currently on the Pre-Authorized Plan pick up your envelopes at the Welcome Table. Parishioners who wish to join the Pre-Authorized Plan can do so by completing the PAP pamphlet found in the Church vestibule and your PAP envelopes will be assigned to you at the Welcome Table.
