"WE SAY NO" Sit-In Results

Last Sunday the rally and Sit-In in protest of the Ontario Governments new Sex-Ed curriculum (which will come into effect at the promise of Premier Kathleen Wynne) saw an estimated crowd of 5500 people there, though the mainstream media has stated 2000 people were in attendance. This is certainly no small number of parents and concerned Ontario citizens who took a big chunk of time out of their Sunday to give witness to their refusal to accept that this is the best our Education Ministry and government can do to "update" what they consider to be an outdated Health and Physical Education curriculum. The way I see it, updating may be necessary but not with the "Sex-Ed" baggage and indoctrination so clear in what has been presented. Proof of just how bad the sex-ed parts are is realized in the fact that I cannot talk about the content of some of the things that would be taught in, say, Grade One, Two and Three here in the bulletin or from the pulpit in church because it wouldn't be appropriate – but it is somehow appropriate for little children to not only hear but learn about in school. If you are trying to make sense of what is actually going on, I would invite you to consider going to markmallett.com and read his articles in his blog under the title ON HUMAN SEXUALITY AND FREEDOM. There he is tackling in a bold way the understanding of what God has given us in the gift of our human sexuality and how we humans are distorting it as if God and creation has nothing to do with what we may choose or choose to believe.

In announcing this series, Mark Mallett has said:

"I want to begin a bold series of writings this week On Human Sexuality and Freedom in order to speak light into the utter darkness that has invaded, in our times, this most precious gift of our sexuality. It is in hopes that someone, somewhere, will find the spiritual food they need in order to begin healing the wounds of their hearts."

As a Catholic evangelist, Mark is reaching out and speaking out in order to address the great hunger in souls for God at a time when people are being sold the lie that sexuality is about one's own personal choices and preferences.

In Part I of Human Sexuality and Freedom, Mark sets the stage of why he is addressing this issue and what he hopes to accomplish in going back to the basics of God, creation and the purpose for all sexuality. He writes in introduction to the series:

"There is a full blown crisis today—a crisis in human sexuality. It follows in the wake of a generation that is almost entirely uncatechized on the truth, beauty, and goodness of our bodies and their God-designed functions. The following series of writings is a frank discussion on the subject that will cover questions regarding alternative forms of marriage, masturbation, sodomy, oral sex, etc. Because the world is discussing these issues everyday on radio, television and the internet. Does the Church have nothing to say on these matters? How do we respond? Indeed, she does—she has something beautiful to say.

"The truth will set you free," Jesus said. Perhaps this is no more true than in matters of human sexuality. This series is recommended for mature readers..."

We are Catholics and have a time-honoured school system in this province that bears our name. If we are willing to roll over and passively accept whatever a government wants to deliver to us in what is clearly a political agenda without saying a word about how that agenda not only opposes the natural law but proposes through teaching an unnatural law in its place, then we will have abandoned God and His Plan for our being and our lives. We are "going it alone" as we thumb our noses at divinity and the Author of all that is saying instead, "we know what is best".

Perhaps the greatest response to this great controversy, besides being informed about what the new curriculum really wants to see accomplished, is to pray. Bishop Barber of Oakland, California says, "The only way you can fight evil is with spiritual power." As the baptized we have that power to intercede before God and ask God to act, to move and to restore what He has given us through the sacred gift of our human sexuality. God will not be mocked..... for long. (Fr. Charles)

THE ROSARY: PRAYER WITH POWER!

There are many forms of prayer used by Christians. For Catholics, liturgical prayer (the Mass, the Divine Office, Prayers used in all of the Sacraments) is the most commonly used as we attend Mass each Sunday along with the entire Universal Church. Some people are more comfortable using known, rote prayers while others like to pray from their heart, expressing in their own words their hearts desire before God. All prayer is directed to God.



The Rosary is a form of prayer that has been familiar among Catholics and many other people for the past 800 years. While it is often attributed to St. Dominic (d.1221) there is not much evidence to support that he in fact gave us the Rosary we now so widely use. He is, however, known to have encouraged its use to sinners who had strayed from the faith, in whatever

form the Rosary had in his time. In the times which even predate the Christian Church beads were often used to recite prayers and later during the Middle Ages within Christianity beads were formed on a single string and used as an aid to prayer with *Our Father's* and *Hail Mary's* being said on each bead. In the 1400's the Rosary, as we are now familiar with it, took shape. By the 16th century the Rosary with its 5 decades of *Hail Mary's* based on the three sets of Mysteries was prevalent.

One of the reasons I feel moved to write this article now about the Rosary is largely due to the fact that in crucial times by both popes and priests as well in apparition messages of Our Lady, the Rosary has been that one form of prayer often encouraged.

Fr. William Saunders, Pastor of Our Lady of Hop Parish in Arlington, Maryland, recalls the powerful use of the Rosary in the 16th Century which led to its widespread use and popularity.

"The Rosary gained greater popularity in the 1500s, when Moslem Turks were ravaging Eastern Europe. Recall that in 1453,

Constantinople had fallen to the Moslems, leaving the Balkans and Hungary open to conquest. With Moslems raiding even the coast of Italy, the control of the Mediterranean was now at stake.

In 1571, Pope Pius V organized a fleet under the command of Don Juan of Austria the half-brother of King Philip II of Spain. While preparations were underway, the Holy Father asked all of the faithful to say the Rosary and implore our Blessed Mother's prayers, under the title Our Lady of Victory, that our Lord would grant victory to the Christians. Although the Moslem fleet outnumbered that of the Christians in both vessels and sailors, the forces were ready to meet in battle. The Christian flagship flew a blue banner depicting Christ crucified. On October 7, 1571, the Moslems were defeated at the Battle of Lepanto. The following year, Pope St. Pius V established the Feast of the Holy Rosary on October 7, where the faithful would not only remember this victory, but also give thanks to the Lord for all of His benefits and remember the powerful intercession of our Blessed Mother."

The Rosary has not only been encouraged in great moments in world history but also in apparitions on earth from heaven. At Fatima, Lourdes, Knock and in all places of reported apparitions, the Rosary is the most common tool that has been given with the great encouragement of saints, popes and priests and from heaven itself. It is seen as a great tool for prayer and even a weapon in fighting against evil.

St. John Paul II stated in Rosarium Virginis Mariae that

"The Church has always attributed particular efficacy to this prayer, entrusting to the Rosary... the most difficult problems. At times when Christianity itself seemed under threat, its deliverance was attributed to the power of this prayer, and Our Lady of the Rosary was acclaimed as the one whose intercession brought salvation."

As well, the chief Exorcist of Rome, Fr. Gabriel Amorth wrote in *Echo of Mary, Queen of Peace* in the March-April edition,

"One day a colleague of mine heard the devil say during an exorcism: "Every Hail Mary is like a blow on my head. If Christians knew how powerful the Rosary was, it would be my end." The secret that makes this prayer so effective is that the Rosary is both prayer and meditation. It is addressed to the Father, to the Blessed Virgin, and to the Holy Trinity, and is a meditation centered on Christ."

"The rosary is the book of the blind, where souls see and there enact the greatest drama of love the world has ever known:

it is the book of the simple, which initiates them into mysteries and knowledge more satisfying than the education of other men;

it is the book of the aged, whose eyes close upon the shadow of this world, and open on the substance of the
