#### LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

### DIVERSE BACKGROUNDS YET A COMMON CALL FOR TORONTO'S NEWEST PRIESTS

### Archdiocese of Toronto celebrates ordination of five men to the Priesthood

Five men were ordained to the priesthood to serve the faithful of the Archdiocese of Toronto this weekend on Saturday, May 10. Cardinal Thomas Collins, Archbishop of Toronto, presided at the Mass which took place at 10 a.m. at St. Michael's Cathedral. Close to 1,000 guests were in attendance.

These newly ordained have undergone a minimum five years of extensive spiritual formation, theological education and field training in preparation for priestly ministry. As priests they will be assigned to one of 225 parishes of the Archdiocese of Toronto which stretches from Oshawa to Mississauga and north to Georgian Bay. The "Class of 2014" includes:

**Reverend Mr. Scott Birchall**, 32, born in Richmond Hill, the youngest of four children. Scott worked as an urban planner for the Town of Newmarket before entering St. Augustine's Seminary in 2008. He has also provided pastoral outreach to migrant workers in the Holland Marsh.

**Reverend Mr. Omar Hernandez**, 32, born in Colombia, the youngest of six siblings. Inspired by a spiritual retreat given by the Neo Catechumenal Way when he was 19, Omar entered the Redemptoris Mater Seminary in Medellin in January 2003 and was sent to Toronto to complete his studies.

Reverend Mr. Marijan Šiško, 37, born in Croatia, the seventh child of eight. Marijan studied to be a chef and hotelier. The death of his oldest brother brought him back to the church, entering the Neo Catechumenal community in his parish. In 2004 he entered the Redemptoris Mater Seminary of Toronto. Reverend Mr. Michael Simoes, 29, born in Toronto, the youngest of three children. Michael studied chemical engineering at the University of Waterloo. Upon completing his degree, he was accepted into St. Augustine's Seminary in 2008.

**Reverend Mr. Neiman D'Souza**, 31, born in Kuwait and moved to Ontario in the late 1980s. Neiman grew up in Markham, attended the University of Toronto, worked at Staples in downtown Toronto and entered St. Augustine's Seminary in 2008.

As one of the most diverse dioceses in the world, the Archdiocese of Toronto is home to 1.9 million Catholics, with more than 800 diocesan and religious priests providing pastoral leadership in churches throughout the GTA. Mass is celebrated each week in more than 30 different languages.

#### MY RESURRECTED FRIEND

The Church of this millennium will not thrive because we know our Catechism. The Church of this millennium will not endure because we fight against the moral collapse of our nation with more vigor and courage. The Church of this millennium will only explode with Faith and passion and zeal if we befriend Jesus, and we make Him the center of our lives. Some have called this revival *evangelical* Catholicism, and others *biblical* Catholicism, and others still (such as myself) prefer to call it simply, *Catholicism*. But no matter what it is called, there can be no doubt that what is missing in Catholic culture, is a clear and obvious focus on Jesus.

Now it would be easy to say in response that the Magisterium of the Church has been talking about Jesus quite candidly in recent years, and this is true. There has been, since the Council at least, a concerted effort on the part of Rome to talk to people about Jesus first, and everything else second, because let's face it, in our two thousand year history, this was not always the order of things.

It would also be easy to say that our liturgy is about Jesus, and the Church is about Jesus, and our doctrines revolve around the truths we know about Jesus and so on. And of course, all of this is true as well. But there are millions of people out there who do not see it that way. All they know is that *you* do not talk about Jesus. They do not hear *you* share the Good News that Jesus has brought to your life and the difference He has made. And quite possibly, there are many in your life right now who are not sure at all about how you would answer Jesus' direct question: *who do you say that I am?* (Matthew 16:15)

Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the living God (Matthew 16:16). But the risen Jesus is also our friend; He told us as much. More and more people are talking about Him. They are making homes and schedules where He is the priority. As St. Francis de Sales put it, they are daily *seeking the God of blessings rather than the blessings of God*. This is the Church of the new millennium. Its teaching hasn't changed. Its Faith hasn't wavered. But Jesus is our friend, and we want to tell people about Him.

### Angels Explained-What You Should Know About the Nine Choirs - Dr. Mark Miravalle

Dr. Mark Miravalle - Professor of Theology and Mariology at Franciscan University of Steubenville gives an enlightening talk on the subject of angels. When we think of angels we probably have in our mind the image of a human person dressed in a long flowing robe with large fluffy wings, or maybe a plump little cute cherub. By using Sacred Scripture, Church Tradition, and the commentaries of St. Dionysius, St. Thomas Aquinas, St. Bonaventure, and other Church Fathers, Dr. Miravalle ignores the juvenile ideas that most of us have held since childhood, and provides the listener with logical and well-grounded information in order to develop a deeper understanding of angels. Why did God create angels? What do they look like? What's their purpose? Why did Lucifer turn away from God? What are the nine choirs of angels? Why are our guardian angels so important to us? This fascinating CD will answer these questions and many more. At times the lecture becomes very theological and a bit of a challenge to follow, but overall I really enjoyed this CD because it shed light on an area of my faith that I am not very knowledgeable about. We don't give much thought about angels, some of us even question their existence. Angels Explained has opened my eyes wide to this God-given "untapped source" that I have been ignoring for most of my life.
