#### LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Manuel Duterte* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Manuel is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. #### THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### **GRATITUDE**

Gratitude can be an every-day reality in our lives before God or a feeling hauled out of the shadows of our life for special occasions such as Thanksgiving.

Over the past few years it seems we have heard of so many natural disasters, each one appearing to be worse than what many people remember in their lifetimes. The recent typhoon, Haiyan which hit the Philippines on Friday November 8th, has been recorded as "the strongest storm ever to hit land" in recorded history, and predictions from weather experts say it is only going to get worse.

I've been thinking about this horrific storm, the news stories, the images and film I've seen on the news and am aware that the one thing I always feel when I hear of these catastrophic events of nature that happen 'elsewhere is grateful. I am grateful for what I have today, standing in this spot, being where I am and in the life I know and that this event has not happened to me. I realize too that it just as easily could have happened to me – but it didn't.

There is also a part of me that perhaps feels a bit guilty about being grateful because somehow it just isn't enough. I can't just be grateful that whatever disaster has fallen on other people didn't fall on me. That would simply be relief that somehow the gods of disaster didn't touch me but someone else, somewhere else. I feel called, compelled to also do something before God to show my gratitude to Him for all of my blessings, comforts and ease of life due to where I live. While I am aware that each time a natural disaster takes place upon a human population, (which so often happens among the poor who already have so little, which is the case in much of the part of the Philippines effected by the typhoon), there are always the appeals made to offer assistance to the ravaged land and peoples which also brings out the scammers who try to take advantage of those who have been asked to give.

No doubt, even though it is hard to get specific numbers, thousands of people are dead, hundreds of thousands are sick and injured and so many people are homeless, without food and water and the basics of everyday life. The people of the Philippines directly affected by this typhoons power and devastation to their land and life don't even have the luxury of time to mourn and bury their dead — they must strive to live and even survive.

Once again the Archdiocese of Toronto has issued an appeal for financial contributions to be made toward aid and the purchase of the very things people need today in order to survive. Through the Catholic relief agency which is already on the ground in the Philippines — NASSA-Caritas Philippines — aid can be quickly and directly relayed to those who need it and based on what their immediate and most pressing needs are. The media is reporting and confirming today (Wednesday November 13, at the time of my writing) that the most important contribution people can make is money which can be used by responsible, trusted and competent relief agencies such as Caritas, to purchase what is needed and get it to the general population.

As always the information for those from our parish who want to give is the same and there are many different ways people can offer their financial help.

Bless the people of the Philippines with your heavenly aid and enable and bless the efforts of those who seek to help, through money and on the ground aid, to bring your love, compassion and care to all those who so desperately need it now, especially those little ones, the children, pregnant mothers, and parents who have others to care for.


