#### LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

#### OCTOBER, MONTH OF THE ROSARY



To those not familiar with the Rosary and to those who have never actually picked one up and prayed it, the Rosary can seem as a prayer form of bygone days or a tool for the superstitious. However, it is neither. I call it, "chaindriven" prayer and, for my own personal preference, best prayed

privately rather than with a crowd. My reason for preferring the Rosary as an individual prayer is that with a group or crowd one can easily become swept away by the "let's get through this" idea. As each of the five mysteries of every Rosary has an individual mystery announced at the beginning of each decade, for example in the Sorrowful Mysteries, the first is Agony In The Garden, usually the one leading the Rosary states the title of the mystery and then begins the Our Father which follows. However, for the Rosary to become meditative one must have time to do so. Now, if someone were to say that the Rosary isn't meant for meditation, they would have overlooked the last prayer said at the conclusion of the recitation: "...that meditating upon these mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary...". Yes, meditating because meditation takes time, silence, quiet. I'm not suggesting that the Rosary can't be prayed in a group as in the right situation this can be most effective as recently seen when an estimated 1.5 million Poles prayed the Rosary along their borders for Mary's intervention and protection against the forced immigration policies of the EU. In this instance this would be regarded as the importance of praying together a common and known prayer.

There is something about the tactile nature of holding a string of beads with a crucifix on the end in our hands as we say prayers appropriate to the lengths of beads (decades) and reflect on the mysteries of Christ's life, death and resurrection as well as the events of His Blessed Mother, Mary. Sitting or kneeling or standing to pray is possible but much more satisfying when we are holding on to something, our fingers and thumb steadily moving along the beads as these keep count for us in the rhythm of prayer and as our accompanying prayers of Our Father's, Hail Mary's, Glory Be's and other prayers are uttered either in silence and within or aloud.

One thing is for certain: beyond its mild appearance and repetitive prayers the Rosary is a powerful form of prayer and a weapon against the sin and evil of this world. The late Fr. Amorth who had faithfully served as the official Vatican exorcist, spoke of that power when he said, "One day a colleague of mine heard the devil say during an exorcism: "Every Hail Mary is like a blow on my head. If Christians knew how powerful the Rosary was, it would be my end." The Rosary consists of 1 Apostles Creed, 5 Our Fathers, 53 Hail Mary's and the prayer which follows each decade and the Glory-Be: "O my Jesus, forgive us our sins; save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls to heaven and help especially those most in need of Thy mercy." We think of our sins as we recall the One who saved us from them and their consequences and that we desire not to be over

We ask to be spared the hellish torments of those who do not know God and perhaps refuse to come to Him. We also ask to be saved from the fires of hell whose doors are locked from the inside as hell is the torment of those who chose not God. We ask Jesus to lead us into heaven and for His mercy to be upon us and all sinners. Anyone can easily learn how to pray the

Rosary by going online and finding a program which will teach you one. (Fr. Charles)

## CATHOLIC CEMETERIES AND THE LOST CHILDREN IN PREGNANCY



While I've written about this topic before it is well worth repeating here once more the fact that Catholic Cemeteries will provide free burial of children who have died through miscarriage or for some other reason. The policies of individual dioceses and Catholic cemeteries within them differ only slightly one from another and generally there is a great deal of respect for the unborn child who has died. In the Archdiocese of Toronto any and all stillborn babies may be

buried in a Catholic cemetery in a common plot free of charge, though it will have no marker, or in an individual grave in the children's section of the cemetery which can have a marker/headstone.

For women and families who suffer the grief of a child that has died before birth it is an even lonelier journey as few people often know that a mother has lost her baby or sometimes others aren't able to articulate sympathy when a couple loses a child it never knew except through maternal, fraternal and familial love. Burial affords the rightful dignity the unborn child has as a beloved child of God. Sadly, in a throw-away society human babies who die before birth are not seen as of value when in reality they are souls God has made and are of infinite value. I urge any parent who suffers the loss of their child at any stage of the pregnancy to ask for the body of their child so that the child may be buried in a Catholic cemetery and its dignity held intact.

In the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, their Catholic cemeteries state the following in their information to parents and families:

In harsh clinical terms, hospitals will call them products of conception. At the Catholic Cemeteries, we prefer babies. Rather than disposal, we offer burial. They are children who do not come to full-term development in the womb. Within our Catholic Christian faith tradition, we believe that God's eternal love offsets the children's lack of earthly viability. In God's sight, a human person is loved and cherished for being, not for doing; for simply existing, not for the number of days alive. Shortness of life and weakness of body mean nothing to our God who transcends these limitations. So, we look upon the babies, in their smallness and vulnerability, like any child of God — long-lived or not. For at some point all of us will die, our viability will cease.

I recall my mother telling me about the little brother three years younger than me whom I never met who didn't survive birth. My mother recalled how she didn't hear the baby cry once she had delivered and the silence that was broken by our family doctor, Dr. Jacew, who said, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." His name is Michael and he is buried near our dad and with his dad in heaven.
