THE U.S. PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION AND THE VICE-PRESIDENT'S DEBATE

The words of W.B. Yeats which come to mind:

"The best lack all conviction,

while the worst are full of passionate intensity."

Senator Pence tried to give a quote from Mother Teresa on the topic of respect for life, though the ever-interrupting Kaine wouldn't let him finish. I know what he was trying to say. It was when Mother Teresa spoke at a National Prayer Breakfast many years ago and sat beside First Lady, Hillary Clinton. Clinton asked Mother Teresa, "Why do you think we haven't had a woman as president yet?", to which Mother Teresa simply replied with the willing the one thing that makes humans saints, "Because she probably has been aborted." 
