#### **Totus Tuus - Summer of 2015**

In August we had our fifth Totus Tuus Youth week in the parish with children from Grades 1 to 6 attending the day program and those in Grades 7 to 12 participating in the evening program from Sunday to Thursday. Our parish, and most parishes, have nothing to compare with this youth camp that conveys practical Catholicism with fun and faith growth. In the day program there was Mass each day and a Holy Hour was held for those in the evening sessions. This year we had a Potluck that was open to the parents and families of the participants as well as our wider parish community. We had a nice gathering with songs and humour from the young children themselves who put on a display of some of the songs they had learned.

Four University age young adults served as the Leadership Team and were greatly assisted by adults and some of our older youth as leaders and helpers. Several of our adult parishioners offered their homes to billet and feed the leaders as well as several more parishioners who prepared dinner for them each evening in their homes. The week flew by for participants and parents and the celebration of our Catholic faith was front and center.

As pastor I have always found this week to be most inspiring to my own faith as nothing edifies the soul more than to see young people falling in love with Christ, which is certainly what Totus Tuus does in just 5 short days. Those parishioners who had their children participate for the first time this year were most impressed with the program and their children's evident joy in participating.

The age for Confirmation in the Archdiocese of Toronto and all its 225 parishes has been moved to Grade 7, beginning this year.

At. St. Leo the Great Parish <u>Grade 8</u> candidates will prepare for and celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in the months from September to November

2015. <u>Grade 7</u> candidates will prepare for and celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in the months from January to April of 2016.

Notification flyers were sent home through our three parish schools in June and a notice also appeared in our parish bulletin. This past week another flyer was sent to parents through our schools reminding them of the change and the two separate programs for 2015/2016.

For parents who didn't receive a flyer or for those in public schools, please go to our parish website stleothegreat.ca, click on *Sacraments*, and click the *Confirmation* button. There you will find full information about our two grade-level programs for this year including all Registration and Confirmation Sponsor forms that can be downloaded and filled out.

#### WHERE TO BURY A DOG

Since Buddy, my 11-year-old Shepherd/Collie dog, died in January Of 2008 in the deep of winter, I had gone through a plethora of emotions I never would have imagined I'd feel. There is the great loss of a constant, faithful, life-giving friend who, in hindsight, shared so much of my living those 11 years and made me feel I was never alone, even when I was without another living soul but him. And there is also the emptiness and sorrow that comes with all loss. I came across this beautiful tribute to a dog and thought of Buddy and my dog Bear who died in 2012 as well as the many other dogs and animals that were much loved by their owners who are parishioners. I think it's beautiful in the true sense of the word. I think it is no coincidence that "dog" is "God" spelt backwards. In so many ways our pets display far better than we humans what unconditional love is really all about. A naturally wild animal that travelled in a pack has evolved, due to its qualities, to become a loyal and trusted friend, who gives far more than we could ever possibly give in return. Over the past few years I have met and looked into the eyes of so many who, like me, uttered those words that choke us in the thinking not to mention the saying; "My dog died."

"We are thinking now of a setter, whose coat was flame in the sunshine, and who, so far as we are aware, never entertained a mean or an unworthy thought. This setter is buried beneath a cherry tree, under four feet of garden loam, and at its proper season the cherry strews petals on the green lawn of his grave. Beneath a cherry tree, or an apple, or any flowering shrub is an excellent place to bury a good dog. Beneath such trees, such shrubs, he slept in the drowsy summer, or gnawed at a flavorous bone, or lifted his head to challenge some intruder. These are good places in life or in death. Yet it is a small matter, and it touches sentiment more than anything else. For if the dog be well remembered, if sometimes he leaps through your dreams actual as in life, eyes kindling, questing, asking, laughing, begging, it matters not at all where that dog sleeps at long and at last. On a hill where the wind is unrebuked, and the trees are roaring, or beside a stream he knew in puppyhood, or somewhere in the flatness of a pasture lane where most exhilarating cattle graze, it is all one to the dog, and all one to you, and nothing is gained, nothing is lost, if memory lives. But there is one best place to bury a dog. One place that is best of all.

If you bury him in this spot, the secret of which you must already have, he will come to you when you call - come to you over the grim, dim frontiers of death and down the well remembered path and to your side again. And though you call a dozen living dogs to heel they shall not growl at him, or resent his coming, for

he is yours and belongs there. People may scoff at you, who see no lightest blade of grass bent by his footfall, who hear no whimper pitched too fine for mere audition, people who may never really have had a dog. Smile at them, for you shall know something that is hidden from them, and which is well worth the knowing. The one best place to bury a good dog is the heart of his master." (Author Unknown)
