In the last bulletin before summer began I published a story on two children of a Barrie family I have come to know quite well over the past decade. The children, 5-year-old Owen and 5-month-old Liam, were both patients of Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto; Owen in need of heart surgery (which is since over and was the best Fontan surgery they had ever seen) and Liam who has Trisomy 18, a syndrome which has plagued his little body since he was born and rendered him unable to go home since his birth.

I had asked parishioners if they would be interested in contributing toward this family of six children, two of them seriously ill, and even though it was summer and the announcement came on the long weekend, our parishioners, (as usual) were more than generous.

In all - \$5,300. has been raised and forwarded to the Janssen's. Thank you to all who contributed to this family in their time of need and for your big hearts and tremendous generosity. Message from the Janssen's –

Dear Fr. Charles and Parishioners of St. Leo the Great,

We would like to extend our sincere gratitude for the tremendous monetary gift you have given us. Your generosity is incredible. We can't say enough to express how much we appreciate this extremely thoughtful and loving gift.

A special thank you goes to Fr. Charles for initiating such a great act of kindness and for the amazing and well written bulletin article on our story with Owen and Liam.

We have put the money into a tax free savings account for now, and have thought about using it towards a new van when it's required, which could be soon. The check engine light is still on. Since Liam was born on April 2nd our lives have changed significantly. Much of our time is spent driving back and forth to Sick Kids and with that we try to juggle looking after our other children and home. This has no doubt been a very difficult journey, but we've had this amazing strength that's been with us, and it's the prayers and support of others that have given us that strength. We couldn't have managed so well without all the wonderful caring people to help us through.

Owen and Liam are miraculous gifts from God, which we are very thankful for. They have, and continued to, enrich our lives in many ways. They have taught us to leave everything in God's hands and to be patient and trust in Him. Both Owen and Liam have also helped us to strengthen our relationship with God, and we've experienced many signs that He has been with us through it all.

With society pushing to have babies with Owen and Liam's condition terminated, either through pregnancy or comfort care, they both have become great examples of life. One doctor, who tried to convince us to terminate the pregnancy with Owen, now sees him and realizes what a mistake that would have been. She no longer advises parents to go that route, but instead tells them Owen's miraculous story. We hope that both Liam and Owen can continue to help bring change to the views of life that unfortunately exist.

CATECHIST CORNER

Sometimes I see people raising their hands, palm up while saying the Our Father. Are we all supposed to be doing this?

The short answer: It is not mandatory.

The gesture that you see is an ancient one called the orans and it can even be found painted on the walls of the Roman Catacombs. Typically, when it is depicted in art, the orans is a woman wearing a prayer shoal as a symbol of the Church at prayer.

In the GIRM (the document that governs the rubrics of the Mass) the orans is only mentioned in association with the priest, and it is clear that he is to be doing the orans during the Lord's Prayer (sec. 152, 153). When the same document discusses how the faithful are to participate in the Lord's Prayer the GIRM does not prescribe any action. There are two ways to interpret this. Either the orans posture during the Lord's Prayer is a gesture reserved for the priest alone or it is one option among many for use by the people in the pews.

So which is it, should we do the orans or not? As theological heavy weights in the Church take different positions on the issue, it really is difficult to say, 'well the Church teaches' on this one. All we know is that the orans posture is not mandatory for the people in the pews, because if it was mandatory the GIRM would clearly say so.


