18th and 19th Sundays in Ordinary Time

Thank you to all who participated in the Mass of Installation celebrated by Bishop Dombrowski on July 17th, many people commented on the beautiful music from our Spanish, Croatian and English choirs—you could feel the Holy Spirit in our midst.

We had a beautiful bus pilgrimage of the Shrines of Quebec from Monday July 18th to Friday July 22nd. There was a total of 41 pilgrims, some from Sts. Francis-Martin and some from St Justin along with others from Windsor and Petrolia. From the Oratory of St Joseph & Br Andre (St Andre Bes-sette) to Ste Anne de Beaupre to Notre Dame du Quebec in Old Quebec City and to Cap du Madeline (the Shrine of Our Lady of the Cape) we were kept busy praying. We almost got lost when this “fellow” took over the driving.

18th Sunday Year C

Jesus does not condemn riches as long as they don't master us – we have one master and he is in heaven. We are to be good stewards of our treasure, time and talents. This rich man that is presented to us in the Gospel this Sunday looks to his riches for his security and happiness and doesn't realize that that very night his life will be demanded of him – and all of his possessions that dominated his thoughts and concerns throughout his life will be given to a stranger – he will take nothing with him. I bet you and I will never see a funeral coach pulling a U-Haul van stuffed with furniture and the like. If we do – what a pitiable sight it would be. (I say this because nothing nowadays would surprise me). What we do take with us is the good we do for God and for others – the charitable acts, the healing words, the works of service – we can load a great treasure which will follow us into eternity. The treasures of heaven, which no moth can destroy or burglar take – these are the treasures we should be concerned with.

19th Sunday Year C

Our Gospel from Luke is quite striking with vivid images.

“Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival.”

Have you ever waited in bed, not able to sleep until you heard the garage door close or the front door open knowing that your son or daughter has come home safely – I know that my mother always did this with me. She couldn't rest until she knew that I was home safe and sound. That same expectant hope and love we are to have in our relationship with Christ – waiting for his call, his knock – asking ourselves how will the Lord come to me today ?

The lighted lamps are the symbol of faith – waiting in faith that the Lord is coming. Not just at the end of time or at the hour of our death but each day he comes to us. Do we prepare ourselves to hear him in his word in sacred scripture, do we prepare our hearts as he comes to us in holy communion – is there an expectant hope as we walk up the aisle?

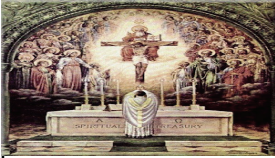

Saints of the Week: St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) A brilliant philosopher who stopped believing in God when she was 14, Edith Stein was so captivated by reading the autobiography of Teresa of Avila that she began a spiritual journey that led to her baptism in 1922. Twelve years later she imitated Saint Teresa by becoming a Carmelite, taking the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross.

Born into a prominent Jewish family in Breslau, Germany—now Wroclaw, Poland—Edith abandoned Judaism in her teens. As a student at the University of Göttingen, she became fascinated by phenomenology--an approach to philosophy. Excelling as a protégé of Edmund Husserl, one of the leading phenomenologists, Edith earned a doctorate in philosophy in 1916. She continued as a university teacher until 1922, when she moved to a Dominican school in Speyer; her appointment as lecturer at the Educational Institute of Munich ended under pressure from the Nazis.

After living for four years in the Cologne Carmel, Sister Teresa Benedicta moved to the Carmelite monastery in Echt, Netherlands, in 1938. The Nazis occupied that country in 1940. In retaliation for being denounced by the Dutch bishops, the Nazis arrested all Dutch Jews who had become Christians. Teresa Benedicta and her sister Rosa, also a Catholic, died in a gas chamber in Auschwitz on August 9, 1942.

Pope John Paul II beatified Teresa Benedicta of the Cross in 1987 and canonized her 12 years later.
