14th and 15th Sundays in Ordinary Time

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time — July 9, 2023: “Come to me” – Jesus invites us to come to him with all that we are; not as we wish **we** were, not as we hope to be but as we **are** – bruised, tattered, sinful, graced, talented, beloved. Well, you might say, “Of course I come to him as I am, what else can I be?” We need to **consciously** know and **accept** what we are; we need to know ourselves. We can’t give over to Jesus something we are not aware of. So, we come to Jesus in **humility** – the greatest of all of the virtues. We know we are weak, so we come to him in our weakness for help. He wants us to come as we are. When we come to Jesus out of place of dependency, we are coming to Him with open hands and hearts. When we receive Holy Communion, we come with outstretched hands like beggars (if we receive in the hands), if we come with our mouths open, hungry for Him, we come to him as hungry for his love and mercy.

What wearies you? What heavy burdens are you carrying? Take them to the Cross and lay that at His feet, over and over again. Jesus reveals himself to us this Sunday as “gentle and humble of heart”. We are called to accept his invitation and learn from Him. “Learn from me”. The yoke he asks us to embrace is the Gospel, the way of life set down for us, the life that Jesus lives. The Gospel is a burden that is light and an easy yoke when borne with Christ, with His grace.

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time — July 16, 2023: How receptive to God’s Word and Will are we? Not any easy question to answer. I suggest that we vary in our receptivity to God’s Word and Will throughout our days. Most people are not just one of the examples that Jesus gives us about the sower and the seed, and the receptivity of the soul of our souls.

1. The path – hardened, baked soil, clay like made so by the beating heat of the sun. Not very receptive to new life. Life can beat us down; we can turn in on ourselves because we have been hurt or abused by others. We can harden like baked clay. In this state we are not open to new life, the seed. We hear the Word with our ears but it does not penetrate the hard soil of our minds and hearts and the birds come and eat them up (the seed). But the “dew” of the Holy Spirit can invigorate this parched land and make it receptive to God’s Word.

2. Rocky ground – no depth of soil. Sometimes we are half-hearted in our response to God. We respond to God, but we have no depth – no spiritual reserves as it were, and our response, our good intentions quickly fall away. Responding to God can be inconvenient for us.

3. Thorns – The seed is planted but so are the weeds, the thorns. What competes for our attention, our love? What little “idols” have we set up on the altars of our hearts? What is vying for God’s sovereignty in our lives?

4. Good soil – we hear the Word of God, it penetrates our minds and hearts - with the grace of the Holy Spirit it bears fruit, “some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty”.

There is a beautiful icon in the St. John’s Collegeville Bible of Christ dressed in overalls, out in the midst of the fields, sowing seed. Christ daily sows the seed of the Word, are we open to it?
