12TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JUNE 23, 2024

Why do we have such a penchant to challenge or doubt God? Job is confronted with the reality that God is sovereign, "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth..." God replies to the questions of Job. Yes, there are many things that we may have a hard time dealing with – but God has revealed to us all that we need to be saved. We may look at the world and the evil in the world and ask – how can God allow this. One may answer – how can we allow this? It's amazing how many things get blamed on God when we are responsible. People starve to death because of the greed of others – not God. He tells us how to live, but we often don't listen.

Yet God remains in the boat of our lives – sometimes seemingly asleep. The apostles are terrified by the storm – they believe they are going to die. Yet they didn't stop to think who was in the boat with them. He awakens and calms the storm – "Peace, be still!" Our Lord has said these same words to me in my life when the storm raged around me – Peace, be still – he calmed the storm – and restored my peace. "The love of Christ urges us on..." St. Paul proclaims. With the love of Christ we can continue our daily pilgrimage, our walk with and in the Lord. Do we allow the Lord to calm our storms? Do we acknowledge his presence in our lives?

Church Etiquette

The essential elements of the Eucharistic prayer are presented succinctly in the Catechism:

In the Preface, "the Church gives thanks to the Father, through Christ, in the Holy Spirit, for all his works: creation, redemption, and sanctification. The whole community thus joins in the unending praise that the Church in heaven, the angels and all the saints, sing to the thrice-holy God." [6]

In the Epiclesis, the Church "asks the Father to send his Holy Spirit (or the power of his blessing) on the bread and wine, so that by his power they may become the body and blood of Jesus Christ and so that those who take part in the Eucharist may be one body and one spirit (some liturgical traditions put the epiclesis after the anamnesis)." In the heart of the Eucharistic prayer, the Institution Narrative, "the power of the words and the action of Christ, and the power of the Holy Spirit, make sacramentally present under the species of bread and wine Christ's body and blood, his sacrifice offered on the cross once for all." [8]

After the Institution Narrative follows the Anamnesis, in which "the Church calls to mind the Passion, resurrection, and glorious return of Christ Jesus; she presents to the Father the offering of his Son which reconciles us with him." [9]

In the Intercessions, "the Church indicates that the Eucharist is celebrated in communion with the whole Church in heaven and on earth, the living and the dead, and in communion with the pastors of the Church, the Pope, the diocesan bishop, his presbyterium and his deacons, and all the bishops of the whole world together with their Church." [10]

The first Canon is called the Roman Canon. Since Vatican II there are three others. The new compositions contain elements both of the Latin and of the Eastern traditions. Subsequently, further Eucharistic Prayers have been added to the Missal.

In the oldest Roman tradition, the Canon begins with what we now call the "Preface," a solemn act of thanksgiving to God for his innumerable benefits, especially for his works of salvation. The Sanctus was introduced at a later stage, and the Preface was separated from the subsequent prayers. It is a characteristic of the Roman Rite that the text of the Preface varies according to the liturgical season or feast. The earliest Mass Collections had many different Prefaces, which were greatly reduced already in the early Middle Ages, so that the Missale Romanum of 1570 only retained 11 of them. Subsequently, a number of Prefaces were added, and it was certainly one of the gains of the most recent liturgical reform to enrich the corpus of Prefaces by drawing on ancient sources. [12]

The Eucharistic prayer ends with the Doxology – "Through Him, with Him and in Him..."

In Canada, we kneel after the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) until after the Great Amen, and then we stand. In some countries, they kneel from after the Sanctus until the proclamation, "The Mystery of Faith, and then they stand.
