November 13, 2022 - 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

On this 33rd Sunday in Ordinary time we are drawing close to the end of the Church year with Advent only two weeks away. Our readings begin to speak of judgement and the return of Christ in glory: talk about endings and glorious comings. "We are in the age between our Lord's first coming and His last. We live in the new world begun by His life, death, Resurrection and Ascension, by the sending of His Spirit upon the Church.... but we await the day when He will come again in glory".

Just before our reading today from the Gospel of Luke, Jesus has just noticed a poor woman giving all she had to the temple treasury. When he looked up, he saw some wealthy people putting their offerings into the treasury and he noticed a poor widow putting in two small coins. He said, "I tell you truly, this poor widow put in more than all the rest; for those others have all made offerings from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has offered her whole livelihood."

Now we enter today's readingThen, while some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings, he said, "How beautiful was the temple, how precious did those stones shine in the sun's light, but soon not one stone would stand upon another."

What that poor woman did will be remembered for ever, her act of trust by giving everything (although it was little in the sight of the world) to God remains to this day – the temple does not. The destruction of the temple and the signs of the end speak of the end of the world, the judgment and the second coming of Christ. With the Temple's destruction, the center of Jewish worship and identity is destroyed. The glory of the Temple will be destroyed. How this would strike the heart of the Jewish hearer of that day.

Christ is also pointing that the true temple will be the believer, God's dwelling place. In the end there will be persecution and betrayal – natural disasters and wondrous signs in the heavens. But persevere to the end with God's grace.

The end will come, whether it be on the last day when the sun will never set again, or on a more personal level, when we die and stand before our Lord – it is coming. We need to celebrate and live each day in our walk, our pilgrimage with the Lord. We are not in this alone, we walk with Christ, with each other. We truly are companions on the journey.
