Dear parishioners,

As part of the formation of our Family of Parishes it was required of us to form a new Pastoral Council that would reflect the needs and characteristics of each parish in the family. This has not been an easy task to achieve. I want to thank all of those who have participated in this prayerful process. With our current members, we still have a need to represent our demographics better so some new members will be asked to prayerfully accept my invitation to join.

Last year's task, after the initial formation of the council, was to fashion a "Vision & Mission" statement. With the help of Claire Bondy from the diocesan center we worked together, as a team in a prayerful spirit, to arrive at a statement.

Vision Statement - To be a home for those seeking Christ, united in diversity, for the service of God.

Mission Statement - Empowering the faithful for the service of God by calling each person forth to know and share their gifts in mutual service.

As we continue to journey as a Family of Parishes, we will unpack with you what we believe the Holy Spirit has led us to in these "Vision" and "Mission" statements. Just to put a nicely framed mission and vision statement on the wall and walk away - job completed - is not what we want to see happen. We need your "buy-in". We want to share with you the "Why" we saw these points as crucial to our Family.

We then identified 1 (one) element that we felt called to emphasize and explore this first year - and that was the concept of "home." What is it to be a home and the importance of hospitality?

In the recent meditations that were presented at the Synod on Synodality – Fr. Timothy Radcliffe presented some moving images and examples of what "Home" is and what we are called to make it. We have used some of these meditations with our PPC (Parish Pastoral Council as well as with our Pastoral staff).

"At home in God, and God at home in us." Fr. Radcliffe reminded us that home is the place to be accepted and challenged. God made his home with the ancient Israelites in the Tent of Meeting - literally sometimes following and at other times leading the Israelites during their desert trek. In the fullness of time God made his home in the womb of the virgin Mary. How do we see our parish communities and our family of parishes as "Home"?

We know that the ultimate "home" is the Kingdom but here on earth we are called to strive for the building up of the Kingdom in our midst. We must also recognize that we need to go out beyond our walls (and our comfort zones) and meet people on the road - as Jesus did in the powerful gospel story of the encounter on the road to Emmaus.

One aspect of "Home" for us is that it must be centered on the Eucharist. We are to be a "Eucharistic Home" where we gather around the Table of the Lord. The Eucharist must be central to our lives as Catholics. To this end, we have arranged to give every family in our Family of Parishes a copy of a book "Beautiful Eucharist" by Dynamic Catholic in the United States. This book shares some incredible testimonials as to the life changing effect of the Eucharist in the lives of ordinary Catholics just like us from around the world. These books will arrive to coincide with Advent, and they will be in English and Spanish.

To continue the theme of the Eucharist this year we will be having a Parish Mission given by Fr. Tom Rosica, CSB in March 2024 (in both Spanish and English). The theme, of this Lenten mission will be on the Eucharist. More information will follow on this in the new year. So, we have much to look forward to and much to do.
