This year World Mission Sunday will be observed on 24 October 2021. Through this letter, I want to encourage the fullest participation of our parishes and Catholic Communities, and to ask you to support the World Mission Sunday collection. Each year at this time, we are called to focus our attention on the great needs of the Church in the Developing World. This year's scriptural theme, "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20) reminds all baptized Catholics of their responsibility to share in the missionary work of the universal Church. In times of tragedy, natural disaster, war, and persecution, many people look to the Church and her missionaries for help and hope. World Mission Sunday celebrates our unity as a human family and provides an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of missionaries and of the Church among the suffering and the poor. All parishes and Catholic Communities, therefore, are to invite the faithful entrusted to their care to contribute towards this collection.

THE STRUGGLE TO TRUST

This past weekend I suggested in the homily that we look at our own struggle to trust. After the weekend I came across this article that I want to share with you.

“How can we get there? How do we pull the trigger on trust?

This is a journey that takes a lifetime. To master this is to be a saint. So, we shouldn't be surprised if we still find ourselves, at least on any given day, a long way from where we want to be.

Here's some good advice from Sr. Ruth Burrows, the British Carmelite. In her “Guidelines for Mystical Prayer”, she offers us this:

Surrender and abandonment are like a deep, inviting, frightening ocean into which we are drawn. We make excursions into it to test it, to see whether it's safe, to enjoy the sensation of it. But, for all kinds of reasons, we always go back to dry land, to solid ground, to where we are safe. But the ocean beckons us out anew and we risk again being afloat in something bigger than ourselves. And we keep doing that, wading in and then going back to safety, until one day, when we are ready, we just let the waters carry us away.”
