October 29th - 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Justice. We are to seek justice; we are to be just in our actions, and we are to seek justice for our neighbours. We are called to love with the totality of our being, heart, soul, and mind. We are to love our neighbour as we love ourselves.

God is just. In our first reading from the book of Exodus, God reminds the children of Israel not to oppress the alien, the widow or orphan; do not abuse them for "I will surely heed their cry..."

Paul reminds the Thessalonians to continue to model their faith in their lives – to be an example for others.

In the Gospel according to Matthew, Jesus reminds us that we are called to love God with all that we are and to love our neighbour as we wish to be loved and treated. This can be a challenge at times, especially when our neighbor may hold opinions that go against everything we may stand for. But we are called to acknowledge in the "other" that they too are a child of God. We may disagree passionately about a subject, but we must, in the end reverence the God who dwells within, yes within even our enemies.

By now we have all seen pictures and heard the news of the horrors of October 7th in Israel. Let us hold up to God the innocent victims of senseless acts of violence, may God cherish these victims in His eternal embrace. We also turn in prayer and lift up to God the thousands of innocent Palestinian civilians whose lives are caught up in this horrible conflict. To those who mourn the dead – Lord give comfort. May the Holy Spirit move the hearts and minds of government leaders and people who have influence over others to find both peace and justice for both Israeli and Palestinian.

May the land which our Saviour trod; the land, which was marked by His blood, find peace, a lasting peace in Him.

If you feel so moved, please pray daily the prayer that was composed by the Franciscans at the Basilica of the Annunciation in Nazareth which is reprinted here in this bulletin.
