




Here we are, on the cusp of a new year. It's the perfect day to reflect on the past year's blessings and to set our hopes on those yet to come. Imagine all the families that are doing this very thing today – engaging in this "dual vision" of the past and the future. It's not hard to imagine the Holy Family doing the same thing as well. They, too, had much to look back on and much to anticipate! perhaps Mary recalled the angel's words about Jesus at the Annunication, "He will be..called Son of the Most High" (Luke 1:32). Joseph must have remembered his dream, when the angel told him to name Mary's son Jesus, "because he will save his people from their sins" (Matthew 1:21). Remembering these dramatic interventions must have helped this couple to trust in god's faithfulness and to know that their future was safe in his hands.

Joseph and Mary weren't the only ones to engage in this dual vision. Simeon shared his vision with them as well. Holding the infant Jesus, he saw the fulfillment of all God's promises and the hope for the future salvation of Israel.

This is a day to be amazed at God's blessings – and to know that even better things have yet to come!



This feast is a celebration of Marv's motherhood of Jesus. The title "Mother of God" is a western derivation from the Greek Theotokos, which means "God-bearer". On this day, we are reminded of the role that the Blessed Virgin played in the plan of our salvation. Through the Holy Spirit, God the Father prepared Mary to be the dwelling place where His Son and His Spirit could dwell among men. Christ's birth was made possible by Mary's fiat, or sanctioning of God's plan with her words, "Be it done to me according to thy word". Calling Mary "Mother of God" is the highest honor we can give to her. Just as Christmas honors Jesus as the "Prince of Peace", the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God honors Mary as the "Queen of Peace".
