It is a situation that plays itself out in more and less significant ways: Christians divided.

A CYO basketball game between two neighboring parishes.

Parents of the young players scream insults and threats at one another and assert their "superiority." A Protestant and a Catholic church sit on adjoining properties. Each is vigilant about having parking violators removed from its own "private" parking lot. An old pastor retires but continues to reside at the parish. A new pastor arrives and quickly finds his faith "community" choosing sides against him.

Saint Paul addresses similar disagreements in the early church at Corinth. He encourages the church there to make up their differences and to be united again in their belief and practice.

Today's first reading from Isaiah speaks of a people weighed down by the yoke of sin and darkness. Certainly the bickering and differences among us can be classified as such. The Gospel tells of the beginning ministry of Jesus. The Light has come, encouraging us to "repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

'THE ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF EVANGELIZATION TODAY': The Episcopal Commission for Doctrine of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) has issued a text entitled "The Essential Elements of Evangelization Today". Written from the context of the Canadian pluralist society, this new 16-page document is intended not only for priests, consecrated men and women, and those actively involved in pastoral work, but also for "all Catholics who desire to understand better and respond more zealously to their call to evangelize the modern world." Although composed prior to the release of Pope Francis' recent Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel), its approach and recommendations are similar, while providing a uniquely Canadian perspective. They will comprise 16 electors and 3 archbishops emeritus, from twelve different countries. Archbishop Gerald Cyprien Lacroix of Quebec is among the new cardinals to be appointed.
