Rites of Enrolment

On the weekend of **January 10th/11th**, we will celebrate the Rite of Enrolment with the children and their families who are preparing for the sacraments of **Reconciliation and First Communion**.

All children who are registered to receive First Communion during the Easter season of 2015 are required to attend one of the three Masses this weekend.

The following weekend, **January 17th/18th**, we will celebrate the Rite of Enrolment with the children and their families who are preparing for the sacrament of **Confirmation**.

All children who are registered to be Confirmed in June 2015 are required to attend one of the three Masses this weekend.

This is the first formal stage in the preparation of children for the sacraments of initiation. Parents bring their children to the Church and present them to the community. The faith community to which the child belongs has the duty and privilege of witnessing and supporting them in their journey towards full initiation in the Church. The children will express their desire to begin preparations for the sacraments and the parents accept the responsibility of supporting their children during the preparations. As well as accepting these candidates, the parish community promises to offer them support through their prayers and example. The Rite of Enrolment is not something nice we do for the candidates. The parish community is called not to be an observer of the rite but an active participant in it.

When we commit to supporting these candidates through our example, we need to consider how we as a faith community reflect the presence and guidance of the Holy Spirit. Do we demonstrate that we live in a Spirit of unity and hospitality? Is love, encouragement, cooperation and self-giving alive in our community? As we publicly witness the journey of these children, we are reminded that our journey in the Holy Spirit is ongoing not only in our personal lives but in the life of our parish community of St. John the Apostle.
