HOLY WEEK FOLLOWING CHRIST TO THE CROSS AND RESURRECTION PASSION [PALM] SUNDAY

Today we enter into the heart of the Gospel and our faith. Again, we look at the question of life and death, with a focus on Jesus' suffering and death. We are always looking forward, but there is no escaping death — and for most of us — some level of suffering in life. How do we deal with, accept and relate to this reality? Fortunately, we have a model in Jesus. He fulfills the prophetic message of Isaiah about the **Suffering Servant of God**. He is the Son of God "who emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave". He was the Humble Servant throughout His public ministry and "humbled himself...even unto death on the cross" (Letter to the Philippians.) Will the model inspire or repel us? Or, in a world of "reality" in the media, will it have any impact at all?

THE TRIDUUM



Holy Thursday of the Lord's Supper begins the Easter Triduum with the memorial of the evening when Jesus, the **Humble Servant of God**, sacramentally anticipated the gift he would

make of himself on the cross. Our Lenten theme of **Serving in God's Reign** is dramatically remembered this evening when we recall Jesus washing of the feet of His disciples. *If you wish your feet to be washed, bring a towel.* The reception in our parish of the oils used in the sacraments and blessed by the Bishop during the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral, is the first of the rites. It is a vivid reminder that the sacraments anoint us to be servants. A blessing and mandating those involved in parish ministries after the homily highlights our sacramental strengthening for serving in God's Reign. *A reminder that there is no morning Mass on this day.*

Good Friday of the Passion of the Lord focuses on the reading of the Passion of Jesus, the Suffering Servant of God.

According to ancient tradition, the cross is venerated. One cross [symbol of our unity in Christ's sacrifice] will be venerated by the parishioners approaching as for Communion, in two lines, beginning from the entrance to the church and using any prayerful gesture (genuflection, bow, touch cross with hand). There is no Mass, but Holy Communion, the sacrament of Christ's love for his church, is received. It is a day of fasting and quiet mourning.



The Easter Vigil celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus, the **Victorious Servant of God**. The vigil opens with a service of light. Beginning in darkness, the lighting of the fire and the Easter candle ritually symbolize that

darkness has been overcome by light. The Paschal candle, carried with loving reverence and lyrically praised in word and song, is a sign of Christ, who is the Light of the World. We will carry individual candles which remain lit during the singing of the Exultet. Readings from the Bible, from creation of the universe, to the Exodus of Israel from Egypt, to the event of Jesus' resurrection, highlight God's creative, redemptive and sustaining love in humanity's salvation story. The great "Alleluia" announces the joyous triumph of the Risen Lord. The elect and the candidates prepared through the RCIA for Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist then receive these Sacraments of Initiation. The blessed Easter baptismal water sprinkled over the parishioners signifies the blessing of new life. We then renew the promises of our Baptism which immersed us into the life of the Trinity. Rejoice! The Word who made all things, as a new Adam, freshly proclaims God's promise of Life, triumphing over fear and death. All creation celebrates God's love with us and we enter fully into the Paschal Mystery of Christ in Holy Communion.

Good Friday Pontifical Collection: April 14, 2017 for the benefit of the Holy Places in the Holy Land. Our parish, once a year on Good Friday, is called to support Christians in the Holy Land. Many Christians in the Holy Land depend on the collection for their lives. Requested by Pope Francis, the Annual Good Friday Collection helps to maintain not only the Holy Places above all, but also the pastoral, welfare, educational and social works that the Church carries out to the benefit of the Christian brothers and sisters and the local population.


