Pope Francis writes: "The urgent challenge to protect our common home includes a concern to bring the whole

human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development, for we know that things can change." Laudato Si #13

But as Pope Francis reminds us, *"it is often a woman, full of faith and hope, who restores strength to people and guides them along the paths of hope" (General Audience, 25 January 2017). This includes promoting social structures that support the health and well-being of all people. "The presence of women in a domestic setting turns out to be so necessary for the transmission to future generations of solid moral principles and the very transmission of the faith."*

Did you know that a peace agreement is 35% more likely to last at least 15 years if women help build it? By adopting effective community-based and non-violent approaches and by forming networks that cross political, religious and ethnic boundaries, women transform peace and reconciliation processes. [Development & Peace 2017].

Women manage a broad range of consumption and production decisions that reduce greenhouse gas emissions. As farmers and foresters, they pull carbon out of the atmosphere and sequester it in soils and vegetation. Through cooperative and future-oriented approaches to leadership, as well as a tendency to manage risk more conservatively than men do, they contribute powerfully to social resilience and can help societies adapt to climate change. Increasingly, women are acting directly on climate change as policymakers and negotiators.
