

ST. RAPHAEL GREEN CORNER: World Water Day March 22: Groundwater, Making the Invisible Visible

Pope Francis writes: "Even as the quality of available water is constantly diminishing, in some places there is a growing tendency, despite its scarcity, to privatize this resource, turning it into a commodity subject to the laws of the market." LS #30

"Groundwater is invisible, but its impact is visible everywhere. Out of sight, under our feet, groundwater is a hidden treasure that enriches our lives. Almost all of the liquid freshwater in the world is groundwater. As climate change gets worse, groundwater will become more and more critical. We need to work together to sustainably manage this precious resource. Groundwater may be out of sight, but it must not be out of mind."

What are some ways that we can ensure that the precipitation (snow and rain) that we receive penetrates the ground and is stored as ground water?

Plan a Rain or Bog Garden: It collects rainwater and runoff from snow and rain and filters it into the ground to prevent water runoff and flooding! Think Green Gardens! Winter won't last forever.
