On October 16th, **"World Food Day"** was celebrated. It is a day of action dedicated to tackling global hunger.

**Pope Francis writes:** "there is a great variety of smallscale food production systems which feed the greater part of the world's peoples, using a modest amount of land and producing less waste, be it in small agricultural parcels, in orchards and gardens, hunting and wild harvesting or local fishing. Economies of scale, especially in the agricultural sector, end up forcing small- holders to sell their land or to abandon their traditional crops. Their attempts to move to other, more diversified, means of production prove fruitless because of the difficulty of linkage with regional and global markets, or because the infra-structure for sales and transport is geared to larger businesses." Laudato si #129

Did you know that 795 million people in the world do not have enough food to lead a healthy active

*life?* 600 million of these people are women and children! http://www.greeningtheblue.org/event/world-food-day Did you know that one in 10 people in Halton do not have enough food to eat? St. Raphael's Conference St. Vincent De Paul provided food for 148 people in the last three months (adults and children). Support St. Vincent de Paul!

*What can we do?* We are what we eat, so we need to eat more sustainably. The way in which food is produced, transported, packaged and prepared can have significant environmental impacts. If you really want to eat sustainably, then keep the following in mind:

•Choose locally sourced food products where available. •Fair Trade products deliver significant social benefits to food producers. It ensures that they are paid fairly for their work!

•Easy on the meat: the carbon footprint of meat is significant, so reducing your meat consumption will have an impact. Try "Meatless Mondays" at your dinner table! •"Eat your View": if we don't eat locally, farmers will be put out of business and our local farmland will become urban sprawl.

•Did you know that many of our grocery store fruits and vegetables come as far away as 2,000 kilometers and sometimes farther! Think of the amount of fossil fuel it takes to provide us these foods. (It takes 56 calories of fossil fuel to provide us 1 calorie of food energy!) •Here is a short video from Michael Pollan, "Why Eat Local"
